

Summertime Neighborhood Improvements

The Meadowood Neighborhood Association has been working on improving the appeal of our neighborhood with two projects this summer – staining the perimeter fences and replacing two signs.

There are two original brick walls with Meadowood signage along S. Winston Street at E. Hampden Avenue, that were constructed by Wood Brothers when the subdivision was established around 1970. The original signs were wood. While lasting over 50 years, these signs were starting to show their age! So we commissioned Yesco to manufacture two new metal signs and they are now installed.

The Meadowood Neighborhood Association Board has a goal to improve the look of our neighborhood. One project is to apply stain to the perimeter fences, creating a more unifying look.

This summer we are concentrating on the fences along Chambers Road. The current Phase III is on the west side of Chambers. We are about halfway through the staining process of this section, with 25 out of 42 homeowners participating so far. The members of the MNA Board are in the process of contacting the remaining households for approval.

Phase I and II, along South Buckley Road, between E. Yale Avenue and Dartmouth Avenue, had an overall participation rate of 83%. Please let us know your feedback – do you like the color? Does it improve our neighborhood?

Aurora Water Moves To Normal Watering Stage

Although Aurora's reservoir levels remain below average, the abundant rain has reduced outdoor water demands, allowing Aurora residents to use less water. City Council has lifted the stage 1 drought, and Aurora is in a normal watering stage. Customers may choose any three days to water each week. Watering between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. is not allowed until Oct. 1. And, just because you can water more often, doesn't mean you need to. The monthly watering schedule provides enough supplemental water to keep your turf happy and healthy. Please remember, because our reservoirs have not fully recovered, continue to use water wisely. Aurora Public Schools: From 1 School to 65!

I thought it would be fun to do a brief history of Aurora Public Schools. I once found information about long, long ago when there was a tiny school built on runners which would be moved from little settlement to little settlement. The earliest stable school was built where E. Jewell and Powhaton Mile Road intersect and was called Coal Creek School which serviced the few children who lived on farms in the area. Around 1885, William Smith became the first official superintendent with a school named after him.

Currently there are almost 40,000 students and 2,000 staff including nurses, lunch room workers, etc. and with a student-teacher ratio of 16-1. We have 65 schools ranging from early childhood to 1 gifted and talented, 12 charters and 1 vocational. There are 6 high schools. Our students come from about 130 countries speaking 160 languages!

One of Aurora's most famous graduates is our current mayor, Mike Coffman, a graduate of Aurora Central.

We have a new superintendent, Michael Giles, Jr. Welcome!

Our school, Dartmouth, has 400 plus students from pre-kindergarten to 5th grade. Its motto is "Every student shapes a successful future." Make it a wonderful year, everyone!

Garden Moment

Let Your Lawn Go Blonde

While we are familiar with the tan browns of dormant grass in the winter, we don't think about dormancy during summer. Just like that sun-kissed look of blonde hair, during July or August, you should let your grass go dormant during these hot days to reduce outdoor water use. Cool-season grass, like Kentucky bluegrass, can require up to two inches of water every week just to stay green.

However, one-quarter inch of water per week keeps the crowns hydrated and alive. It also reduces water consumption by 85%.

This grass will change color, but it isn't dead - it's alive and happy during its nap. To determine the difference between dormant and dead grass, we recommend the tug test. Grab a handful of grass and give it a slight tug. If it offers some resistance, the grass is sleeping.

If you have grass you water and mow but otherwise never use, Aurora Water can help you transform it into a beautiful water-wise landscape.

Pets' Moment



The sudden switch from long summer days of playing with the kids to living in an empty (or busy) home can be a tough adjustment. Here are some tips from behavioral experts on making this yearly seasonal transition as smooth as possible for your dog.

Stock up on toys and fill them with desirable treats like small amounts of peanut butter, frozen banana slices, and dog food. These can be made up ahead of time and put in the freezer until you're ready to use them.

Hide those treats around the house for them to find. Make a game out of it.

Use positive reinforcement training. Encouraging your dog to work and think for their treats is a fun activity for both you and your pet.

Before school starts, begin getting your dog accustomed to the soon-to-be new schedule. Get up early, take your pup out for a rigorous walk, and introduce the activities they can do when everyone is gone.

Take your pup out for a sufficient time in the morning for bathroom time and having the first person to get home in the afternoon take them out again.
