Eagle Park Lighting Issue

Volunteer With Snow Busters

The city's Housing and Community Services Department is preparing for the snow season by recruiting volunteers for the Snow Busters program. This program pairs volunteers with people who live within three miles of them, are incapable of shoveling after a snowfall due to age, disability or other conditions, and have limited financial resources. To volunteer as a Snow Buster, you must:

- Commit to assisting the resident in need for an entire snow season, beginning in the fall and ending in the spring
- Shovel the public sidewalk of the resident within 24 hours of a snowfall of two (2) inches or more
- Be 14 years of age or older
- Pass a background check

Volunteers commit to helping one person for one snow season. This is a great volunteer project for families, church groups, scout troops, and other groups. Apply today at AuroraGov.org/Volunteer. Aurora & Drought

Colorado has a semi-arid environment and is a drought-prone state. The Front Range receives approximately 15 inches of precipitation in the form of rain and snow on an annual basis, which is insufficient moisture to meet the needs for most non-native landscapes without supplemental irrigation. During water shortages, water must be prioritized to meet potable needs for life, safety and health. To learn more about Aurora's drought situation, water conservation and more, visit AuroraWater.org.

In an effort to conserve water while still providing high quality outdoor spaces for residents to enjoy, the city of Aurora has put into place a number of water conservation efforts, including turf conversion in parks around the city.

Turf Conversion

In parks across the city, Parks, Recreation and Open Space staff are converting areas of Kentucky bluegrass turf to water-efficient alternatives, such as native grasses in low-usage areas or drought-tolerant Bermuda turf in high-usage areas. This conversion will reduce water usage in these areas by 70 percent, conserving millions of gallons of water while still providing ample space in our parks for public use and enjoyment.

One location of turf conversion is located on the medians of S. Buckley Road. The conversion process began in May 2023 and seeding has taken place. Initial growth will take place over the following months. As work is being done, guests may see areas at this location with brown grass or patches of dirt. 

The goal of the week-long celebration is to recognize and show appreciation to animal shelters and the individuals who care for homeless animals.

How can YOU participate in the celebration?

- If it's within your means, open your heart and home and adopt a homeless animal.
- Volunteer at your local shelter. There are many jobs to be done. Call the shelter and ask what you can do. Walk the dogs, read to the animals, just spend time with them. It will break up and relieve some of the emotional stress of their day. Many of these dogs were someone's pets before they were in a shelter. They are scared, lonely, and totally confused as to what is going on and why they are there.
- Most shelters work on very tight budgets and can only provide the basics. You can help make conditions a little better by your generous donations. Call your local shelter to see if they have a wish list or any special needs. Blankets, beds, towels, toys, and food are some things that are always needed.
- Monetary donations are always appreciated as well.

Cooking Moment

Cranberry Sauce

- 12 ounces cranberries
- 1 cup white sugar
- 1 cup orange juice

Dissolve sugar in the orange juice in a medium saucepan over medium heat. Stir in the cranberries and cook until they start to pop, about 10 minutes. Remove from heat and place sauce in a bowl. It will thicken as it cools.
