

E-cycling Special Event Pricing Oct. 2-7

The city of Aurora is offering special event pricing for e-cycling for Aurora residents from Oct. 2 to 7. The city's e-cycling event is happening at Techno Rescue—the city's e-cycling partner. The facility at 3251 Lewiston St., Suite 10, will be open from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday, and from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Saturday. Business customers are not eligible for these events.



To address the rising costs associated with processing select electronics, the following additional fees will be applied to recycle these items:

- Liquid Crystal Display (LCD) monitors: \$5 each
- Cathode Ray Tube (CRT) monitors and televisions 32 inches and under, and all sizes of flat screen televisions: \$30 each
- CRT monitors and televisions 33 inches and over: \$50 each
- Floor model printers: \$40 each
- Projection, Digital Light Processing (DLP) & Console TVs: \$100 each

A complete list of items that are not accepted is available at AuroraGov. org/Recycle and go to Electronics Recycling.

Techno Rescue, which is certified for electronics recycling and data destruction, wipes and physically destroys all data storage media to protect the identities of those who are recycling responsibly.

The remaining 2023 special event pricing dates are scheduled from Dec. 26 to 29 (plus Jan. 2 to 6, 2024).

As a reminder, electronics tossed in the trash not only cause serious environmental problems, but also are banned from landfills in Colorado. Environment Aurora, a citywide effort to think green, supports the city of Aurora's e-cycling events. For more info, visit AuroraGov.org/Recycle.



Questions and Comments Welcome at October 24 Meeting On City's Efforts Under Consent Decree Monitorship

The public is invited to attend a hybrid community meeting Tuesday, Oct. 24, regarding ongoing progress related to the city's public safety reform efforts under a consent decree with the Colorado Attorney General's Office. IntegrAssure, operating as the Independent Consent Decree Monitor, will post its fifth and latest report Oct. 15 at AuroraMonitor.org in advance of the meeting. The Community Advisory Council—a group of prominent community leaders that the Independent Consent Decree Monitor convened to offer community input and guidance regarding the city's reform efforts—is hosting the Oct. 24 meeting to provide information on progress being made under the monitorship. To participate, attend the meeting in person at 6 p.m. in the Aurora Municipal Center's Paul Tauer City Council Chamber, 15151 E. Alameda Parkway, or via the virtual platform link that will be available at AuroraGov.org/ConsentDecree. The meeting also may be watched live on Comcast Cable Channels 8 or 880, at YouTube.com/TheAuroraChannel or at AuroraTV.org. During the meeting, the Independent Consent Decree Monitor, Jeff Schlanger, will provide an overview of the fifth reporting period. Dr.Robin Engel from the National Policing Institute, who is part of the monitoring team, will present the Aurora Police Department's enforcement data from 2017-22. The public is encouraged to submit questions and comments in advance by email to connect@auroramonitor.org or via the Contact Us form at AuroraMonitor.org no later than

Friday, Oct. 20. AuroraMonitor.org provides an overview of the monitorship, the monitoring team, the Community Advisory Council, key dates in the monitoring process, reports and helpful resources. Community input is welcome throughout the monitorship via email at connect@auroramonitor.org or the Contact Us form on AuroraMonitor.org. Keeping Your Cat Safe During Halloween

Halloween, a time of spooky delight, brings with it some cautions for our furry friends. Here are some quick tips from the Aurora Animal Shelter to ensure their safety.

- **1. Costume Comfort:** While dressing up pets is fun, prioritize their comfort. Ensure costumes don't hinder movement or cause overheating.
- **2. Candy Check:** Many Halloween candies are harmful to pets. Chocolate, xylitol, raisins, and nuts can be toxic. Keep treats out of reach and help educate others about the dangers of sharing candy with pets.
- **3. Doorbell Distress:** Constant doorbell ringing can stress pets. Create a quiet space away from the front door where they can feel secure amidst the chaos.
- **4. ID and Safety:** Ensure pets have proper identification and a microchip with updated details. The Aurora Animal Shelter can microchip your pet for \$10 on a walk-in basis, and also scan and check microchips for proper functioning.
- **5. Socializing Sensibly:** Some pets enjoy social activities, while others get anxious. Monitor their behavior and remove them from stressful situations.
- **6. Emergency Readiness:** Know the nearest 24/7 vet clinic. Recognize signs of distress like vomiting, diarrhea or lethargy. Act promptly if you suspect something's wrong.

If you are thinking about adopting, the Aurora Animal Shelter in November is offering 50% off on adult dogs and cats (six months and older). The shelter is also looking for volunteers to help with fostering, cleaning kennels and much more.

Garden Moment

Happy Halloween! This year has flown by, hasn't it? After the first frost, perennials and shrubs will start turning brown.



Here are some tips for pruning:

- 1. Make sure pruners or loppers are clean and sharp before diving in to pruning.
- 2. Cut at a 45-degree angle, just above a node (bud) this is usually where leaves are attached to the stem.
- 3. Cutting out dead growth is important, as it increases airflow and allows the plant to focus energy on creating lush new growth and flowers but if the shrubs appear healthy, strict pruning every single year is not necessary.
- 4. Don't be afraid to leave some faded blooms on plants and grasses through the winter they provide gorgeous visual interest in the snowy landscape.

Cooking Moment

Roasted Pumpkin Seeds

- 1 1/2 cups raw whole pumpkin seeds
- 2 teaspoons butter, melted
- 1 pinch salt

Preheat oven to 300 degrees F (150 degrees C). Toss seeds in a bowl with the melted butter and salt. Spread the seeds in a single layer on a baking sheet and bake for about 45 minutes or until golden brown; stir occasionally.


Wonder how to prune Hydrangeas?

First, determine which type of Hydrangea you have:

- Limelight, Quickfire, and classic snowball types, such as Annabelle: Should be pruned in *late winter or early spring*, before the shrub begins active growth. Don't be afraid to prune these varieties hard. Blooms appear on new growth.
- Blue summer flowering Hydrangeas: Should be pruned in *late summer*, once they have finished blooming. Most of these bloom on what's called "old wood" growth from the year before. If you prune them in early spring, you risk cutting off the dormant flower buds. By pruning right after the blooms have faded, you allow the plant time to set buds for the next year. Remove up to 1/3 of the total number of stems on each plant.
- The so-called ever-blooming hydrangeas, such as Endless Summer and Blushing Bride: Should be treated the same. These bigleaf hydrangeas are unique in that they bloom on old wood *and* new wood.
