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Snow Removal

PSA: As a reminder to our neighbors, please remove the snow from the sidewalks in front of your property.

Per City of Aurora Zoning Codes: "Within 24 hours of a snowfall, snow must be removed from all city sidewalks adjacent to your property, including snow on sidewalks outside rear and side fences. Failure to comply will result in Administrative Fees and Fines."

- Sec. 126-311 Enforcement.
- Sec. 126-312 Responsibility for abutting sidewalks.
- Sec. 126-313 Time for removal; penalty.
 - (a) Failure to remove snow. Failure to remove any accumulation of snow and ice from sidewalks under section 126-312 within 24 hours after every snowfall is hereby declared unlawful and constitutes a nuisance as a snow obstruction is a hazard to the public health and safety. When a snow emergency is declared, however, snow and ice shall be removed within 48 hours after announcement of the termination of the snow emergency, as provided in section 134-86 of this Code or is hereby declared unlawful and constitutes a nuisance as a snow obstruction and a hazard to the public health and safety.
- Sec. 126-314 Dumping in public roadway prohibited.
- Sec. 126-315 Notice on premises; administrative assessment.
- Sec. 126-316 through 126-400 *Reserved*.



Mission Viejo Real Estate News

Happy New Year! And happier interest rates. The Feds have lowered the interest rates to just below 7%. This is a welcome change to help bring new buyers to the market. MV currently has 12 active listings, with an average sales price of \$535,000. MV also sold 4 homes with an average of \$479,000. Interestingly noted, the average days on market of those that sold was 22, while those active were much more. This is a clear indication that those homes that dropped their price – sold.

FYI – a home for \$535,000 with 10% down and 6.625% interest calculates to a monthly payment of \$3,756 and \$63,364 to the closing table. That's hard for any first-time homeowner to come up with. It's no wonder why homes have been taking longer to sell. Still, homes are selling but it is a bit of a "Buyer's" market. If you are thinking of selling, it is encouraged to fix the items needing fixed first, so you can be ahead of your competition out there.

3 Facts About President's Day

- 1. Presidents Day is celebrated on the 3rd Monday in February, thanks to the 1968 Uniform Monday Holiday Act.
- It was established in 1885 in honor of President George Washington's birthday.
- 3. Washington's birthday was actually on February 22, 1732 (this would be his 282nd birthday!)

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Groundhog Day

February 2nd is Groundhog Day, on which the emergence of the groundhog (woodchuck) from its burrow is said to foretell the weather for the following six weeks. Since 1887 an animal in Punxsutawney has been the center of a staged appearance each February 2. In what has become a media event, a groundhog designated Punxsutawney Phil is the center of attention of television weathermen and newspaper photographers. Although promoters of the local festival surrounding Punxsutawney Phil claim that the animals have never been wrong, an examination of the records indicates a correlation of less than 40 percent. (Whether a groundhog does or does not emerge is thought to be related to the amount of fat it was able to store before going into hibernation.)

Snow Removal Responsibilities

Snow and ice on sidewalks can be slippery and dangerous, not only to mail carriers and other delivery people but also to senior citizens, children, disabled people and the public in general.

As a resident or property owner, it is your responsibility to keep city sidewalks adjacent to your property free and clear of snow and ice, even though the sidewalks may be behind or outside the rear and side fences and adjacent to any street. Snow and ice must be removed within 24 hours after a snowfall ends, and 48 hours after a snow emergency is declared by the city.
