In Mission Viejo, there are presently 14 homes available for purchase. Among these, 6 are currently occupied by tenants, presenting an interesting opportunity for investors to acquire properties with existing leases. The remaining 8 homes for sale, along with 7 under contract and 9 closed within the last 90 days, paint a picture of our local market.

Analyzing the data, we observe an average of 59 days on the market for listed homes, while those under contract boast a significantly shorter period of just 19 days. This difference shows how importance of pricing your home right. With the added advantage of reduced mortgage interest rates, now might be the perfect time to make your move in the real estate arena!
