Subscriptions To Pay Dues Via Paypal And Stripe – Action Is Needed If You Have These Set Up

If you have a subscription to make your dues payment via PayPal or Stripe, we ask that you cancel all future payments via these providers. Both charge the HOA a fee to transfer the funds to the HOA account. Instead, the board has approved the use of Zelle, which deposits funds directly into our account without paying any fees. The HOA is planning on closing the PayPal and Stripe accounts within the next 30-45 days, so please take appropriate action today. The current board does not have access to the Stripe account, so we have to rely on you to make sure any donations/payments are not made via the Stripe or PayPal platforms.

Paying By Zelle

If you want to make a donation to the Mission Viejo HOA Neighborhood Association you can do so by using the below QR Code. It is very important when making payment you enter your address in the memo. This will allow us to record your name and address for accounting and records keeping. Activating your 2026 Active membership allows Mission Viejo HOA residents to utilize Dumpster Days and the Annual Hay Ride at no additional cost. To send money via Zelle, open your bank's mobile app or online banking platform and locate the Zelle feature. Next, register your email address or mobile number and select the option to send money. Enter treasurer@missionviejohoa.org as the recipient's email address along with the donation amount. You should also email the treasurer, letting them know that a payment has been sent. The Treasurer will then know your payment has been processed and can obtain any other information it needs to ensure you are listed as an active member of the HOA and can participate in activities without any costs. Some residents have reported they had to enter the organization as Mission Viejo Homeowners Assn.

Summer Has Arrived

To conserve water, please make sure you follow watering restrictions outlined by the City of Aurora at: AuroraGov.org/Drought. Residents with even numbered addresses can water on Sunday and Thursday, while residents with odd numbered addresses can water on Saturday and Wednesday. With no Watering between 10 AM and 6 PM.

It is also time to take care of lawns, gardens and trees. City of Aurora Code Enforcement can place a failure notice on your door if your lawn or weeds are more than 6 in. high, if hedges block sidewalks, or if tree branches over streets and sidewalks are within 10 ft. from the ground. All residents are responsible to care for all sides of their property that have public streets and sidewalks. If you receive a notice, you will be allowed a few days to take care of the issue, otherwise the city will send a crew to take care of the issue and assess your property. The HOA paid for 4 sprayings of weed control to the to the exterior of the community because it can be dangerous to spray and remove weeds and trash when traffic is traveling at 40 mph or faster. The cost to the HOA per household along the exterior of the community is less than \$8. Per spraying or \$32. per year. The typical cost for individual spraying per household is often more than \$500. per year. This is a great savings for residents who back up to the exterior of the community. If you live along the exterior and would like to contribute to the cost, please consider contributing to the HOA.

HOA Meeting Survey

In our April 6, 2026 meeting we discussed whether we could/would livestream our monthly meetings. As there are costs associated with obtaining the equipment to do so, we thought it would be a good idea to see how many people would attend meetings virtually, if we sent the funds to make it available. As stewards of the HOA funds, we want to make sure we are using our dollars wisely. The poll is located at <https://missionviejohoa.org> then look for the Virtual Meeting Poll on the main page. The board will discuss this at its July Meeting, so please let us know your thoughts.



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Waste Connections Trash Program

Waste Connections is offering a special rate to residents who are not currently customers. The rate is \$17. Per month, which includes two 96 gallon cans, one for trash (picked up weekly) and the other for recycling (picked up every other week). When signing up be sure to tell them you are part of the Mission Viejo Community. For every resident in the program, Waste Connections, gives the HOA \$2. Per month (paid on a quarterly basis). These funds are used to fund HOA events like Dumpster Day, the Annual Hay Ride, Community Garage Sale, Weed Control along the exterior of the community, and supplies for volunteers who pick up trash along the exterior of the community, and more. The more residents that participate, the more the HOA can give back to the community in the way of events. Please consider joining the program, so that we can continue to make Mission Viejo a great place to live.

Tiny Town: Morrison, CO

A truly unique attraction, Tiny Town is a collection of over one hundred homemade miniature buildings forming a small mountain town. The buildings are built at a 1/6 scale, so children and adults feel like giants while wandering through the town. Besides the buildings, there is also a 15 in. gauge miniature railroad that visitors can ride throughout the park. The track is just over half a mile in length, and a trip on one of the steam-powered trains grants visitors exclusive access to parts of Tiny Town that can't be seen from the sidewalk.
