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## Garden of the Month

Welcome to Kite Hill's Garden of the Month. The inaugural winners are the **Elliott family**, who live at 28982 Jaeger Drive. The landscaping committee picked this garden to be our first winner because it demonstrates some wonderful approaches to the challenging elements that many of us see in our own gardens.

Firstly, there is the hillside garden, that can be very difficult to maintain. The Elliott family has utilized large rocks, trees, bushes, and plants to break up this space, along with a pebble border. This prevents erosion and creates interest throughout the entire hillside.

Next, we have the use of climbers at the front of the house. The Elliott's have bougainvillea growing around their porch. For anyone considering adding climbers at the front of their home, it is advisable to keep the climber on a wooden structure, or up against rock, and keep it away from the stucco.

Finally, we have sloping lawns. These can be very difficult, because they can easily look ragged when the slope becomes steep. The family had this advice about lawn care on a slope. Water regularly, but don't water for too long, as there is a lot of runoff. Make sure to keep the lawn fertilized and enjoy!

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### **Gardening Club**

Hi KH Neighbors! Hope you all had an enjoyable summer! Now we turn our attention to the late summer/early fall growing season. Cucumbers tend to do well in our climate this time of year. Cucumbers are so easy to grow from seed. Sow your cucumber seeds in small pots or trays filled with a multipurpose potting mix. Dampen your potting mix before planting the seeds. The seeds need to be planted around half an inch deep, and

need to be planted around half an inch deep, and it's a good idea to position them at the outer edge of the pot, and lay them on their side, to avoid rotting.

Cucumber seeds need warmth in order to germinate, and ideally need to be around 70°F, so place them in a heated propagator or on a sunny windowsill. Germination should happen within just a few days. Keep your potting mix moist, but not overwet.

Make sure the seedlings don't get cold – they ideally need to stay above 53°F, though outoor varieties are a little hardier. Pot on your cucumber seedlings once they have developed their first set of 'true' leaves. Once your cucumber seedlings have grown to about 10 inches, they can go into their final positions – either in 10-inch pots, grow bags or directly into the garden border.

If planting outside, you need to first harden them off for a few days. Tie your cucumber plants to supports such as canes or netting, as they grow. Water the plants little and often so that the soil doesn't dry out. Cucumbers will need daily watering once the fruits start to develop – after all, they are 96 percent water. Fertilizer cucumbers by



giving them tomato feed once the fruit starts to form. Repeat every two weeks.

Cucumbers do not need to climb – they can just sprawl across the ground. However, growing them as climbers is the most space-efficient method and makes a more striking feature in the garden. A benefit of keeping the plants off the ground is that it can also help reduce the number of pests that visit

them. Cucumber plants produce side shoots and tendrils, so can easily be trained to grow upwards. They also make striking overhead plants, and can be trained over an archway, which looks stunning with the fruits dangling down.

Cucumbers should be harvested when they are around 4-8 inches long, depending on the variety – check the packet instructions. The fruits should be evenly green – if they have gone yellowy or soft, then they are overripe. When harvesting, snip them off with scissors or secateurs (pruning shears). If you try just to pull the cucumbers off, you could uproot the entire plant.

Some varieties of cucumber can be cut in half on the plant, which is ideal when you only need a small amount. The remaining fruit will grow a callous and stay fresh on the plant.

Here are a few options on the September planting list: Beets, Bok Choy, Carrots, Daikon, Endive, Kale, Lettuces, Mustard Greens, Parsnips, Radicchio, Radish, Scallions, Snow Peas, Spinach, Sugar Peas, Swiss Chard, Tomatoes and Strawberries

**Some herbs to plant this month:** Bergamot, Bronze Fennel, Chives, Cilantro, Dill, Fennel, Fenugreek, Lemon Balm, Parsley, Sage, Seasoning Celery, Sweet marjoram, Violas, Watercress
