4th of July Parade & Celebration

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Large Item Pickup: June 12-13

Our annual Large Item Pickup is scheduled for June 12–13. This is your chance to get rid of bulky items that don't fit in your regular trash bins. This is a great time to clean out the garage.

Important Eligibility Information:

Only residents who already paid dues by the May 15 deadline can participate. The trash company will receive a list of eligible addresses for pickup.

What to Do:

- Place items at the end of your property without blocking sidewalks or streets.
- Limit your pile to 2 cubic yards per household (roughly two large trash bins or two refrigerators).
- Break down or bundle large items like furniture, branches, and yard waste to stay within the limit.
- You'll get a sticker indicating participation eligibility delivered to your doorstep by June 7. These must be visible on your pile by 8:00 a.m. on June 12. They don't need to be on every item—just make sure the pile is clearly marked.
- Trucks will only make one stop per address

Items NOT Accepted

- Anything over 150 lbs (not liftable by 2 people)
 - Liquids of any kind
 - Appliances with Freon (fridges, freezers, AC units)
 - Car parts, batteries, oil, tires, propane tanks
 - Hazardous materials (chemicals, fuels, paint, pesticides, etc.)
 - TVs, monitors, printers, fluorescent lighting
 - Household trash, construction debris (dirt, concrete, shingles)
 - Bikes*

Covenant Review Committee and Governance

June Summer Community Reminder

As summer arrives and neighbors spend more time outdoors, the Highlands 460 Civic Association would like to thank residents for helping keep our community attractive, safe, and welcoming for everyone.

Please take a moment to review several important covenant and community reminders:

Trash Container Storage

Trash and recycling containers must not be visible from the street except on scheduled pickup days. Containers should be stored inside garages, behind fences, or otherwise screened from public view after collection.

Residents are also reminded that visible trash containers may violate both Highlands 460 covenants and Centennial municipal code requirements.

RVs, Boats, and Trailer Storage

Boats, campers, trailers, RVs, and similar recreational or utility vehicles may not be stored on neighborhood streets or in residential driveways for extended periods.

These vehicles should be stored in storage locations only. Forty-eight-hour temporary loading and unloading is permitted, but long-term parking or storage is not allowed.

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Cliff Dwellings And Ruins

Colorado is home to several sites which include cliff dwellings and ruins. Take a car trip this summer to view some of these historic places.

Canyon Pintado National Historic District resides in western Colorado. In this district, you'll find rock art and homestead ruins from as early as 1200 AD, much of which is viewable from your car, perfect for those who would rather forego a hike.

Chimney Rock National Monument and Park in Pagosa Springs is a great place to spot ancient Puebloan ruins that date back thousands of years, including kivas, a pit house, and multi-family dwellings.

Hovenweep National Monument is located near Cortez in the southwest corner of the state, and it extends into Utah, where you can find the visitor center. Hovenweep is an ideal spot for camping and ruins-viewing, as you can even see the ruins of Hovenweep Castle and towers built by the Ancestral Puebloan people.

Mesa Verde National Park is the perfect place to view ancient cliff dwellings, as there are over 600 well-preserved dwellings plus 4,000 ruins in this notable archaeological site. Be sure to stop by Canyons of the Ancients if you have the time since it's not far away.

Ute Mountain Tribal Park offers guided tours of cliff dwellings and villages from the Ancestral Pueblo people. You can choose between an easier hike or a more active one, but both are packed with information.
