Six Winter Holidays From Around the World The winter is often cold, desolate, lonely and long. Here are six winter holidays to bring joy and light around the world.

Diwali (November 9-November 14). This five-day celebration is a Hindu festival of lights. It is particularly associated with Lakshmi, the goddess of prosperity, and marks the beginning of the fiscal year in Inda.

Hanukkah (November 28 – December 6). This Jewish festival runs for eight days. The religious holiday is a celebration of Judaism and commemorates the rededication of the Second Temple of Jerusalem. People celebrate by lighting candles, gifting presents and eating traditional Hanukkah food, such as latkes.

Santa Lucia (December 13). Saint Lucy's Day is a feast day in the Christian calendar celebrating Saint Lucy, a martyr who is seen as a figure of light in the darkest part of the year. It's an especially important day in Scandinavia, where the day is marked by atmospheric processions and concerts, featuring singers clad in white and wearing head-dresses featuring actual flickering candles.

Christmas (December 25). Christmas is a Christian festival celebrating the birth of Jesus. From mops and brooms in Norway, fried chicken in Japan, tamales in Mexico, to roller skating in Venezuela, surfing in Australia, and mince pies in England, Christmas is celebrated many different ways around the world.

Kwanzaa (December 26-January 1). First celebrated in California in the 1960s, Kwanzaa is an annual celebration of African-American history and culture, culminating in a communal feast. Festivities typically include dancing, performance and candle-lighting.



Chinese New Year (February 10, 2024). The Chinese New Year is an annual 15-day festival that begins with the new moon that occurs between January 21st and February 20th. This celebrates the start of the zodiac year. This new year it's the Dragon.
