When Is It Too Hot To Walk The Dog?

As the air heats up, so does the pavement, and pavement temperatures can be 40 to 60 degrees warmer than air temperatures. This means that when the outside temperature is 77 degrees (Fahrenheit), black top temperatures are around 125F degrees. Many factors influence when and how a burn occurs but at temperatures above 130 degrees Fahrenheit, skin will show signs of thermal injury within just 60 seconds. This means that if the air temperature is above 80 degrees Fahrenheit, the pavement could potentially be hot enough to burn a dog's feet if it stands on it for long enough. Please check out the chart below on when to walk your pup and when not to!

World Emoji Day

Celebrate World Emoji Day on July 17th by having an emoji-only conversation. The emoji, short for emoticon, as we know it seems to be a pretty recent invention, but the first emoji was actually created in 1862. The New York Times is responsible for the first use of an emoticon - ';)' - when they misprinted a transcribed copy of President Abraham Lincoln's speech. The first intentional use of emoticons was on March 30, 1881 in an American satirical magazine called Puck. AIM, also known as AOL Instant Messenger, used "buddy icons" starting in 1997, and in 1999 Japanese artist Shigeteka Kurita created the first emoji as we know it! National Ice Cream Day: July 23 QUICK HOMEMADE ICE CREAM

- 15 oz whole milk cottage cheese ½ cup strawberries
- ½ cup honey

- ½ cup crushed graham crackers
- 1. Place cottage cheese, honey, and strawberries together in a highpower blender or food processor and blend until silky smooth.
- 2. Fold crushed crackers into mixture.
- 3. Transfer the mixture into freezer freezer-safe container of choice and freeze for 3-4 hours.

TIP: Can replace strawberry and crackers with ¼ cup peanut butter and ¼ cup chocolate chips or 1 ripe banana and 1 teaspoon vanilla extract.

10 Things You Probably Didn't Know About The Fourth of July

1. The Declaration of Independence wasn't signed on July 4 (or in July at all).

The Continental Congress officially voted for independence on July 2, but July 4th was the day the Declaration of Independence was formally dated, finalized, and adopted by the Continental Congress.

2. The first Fourth of July celebrations weren't much different from today's.

Ok, so aside from melting down a statue of King George III to make bullets, or holding mock funerals of the king in effigy, American Colonists celebrated with fireworks, good food, and the day off.

3. Eating salmon on the Fourth of July is a tradition in New England.

Makes sense, salmon is abundant in the middle of summer and the dish eventually got lumped in with the Fourth.

4. Massachusetts was the first state to recognize the Fourth of July.

Massachusetts recognized the Fourth as an official holiday on July 3, 1781. Leave to Congress to finally get around to designating it a federal holiday in 1870!

5. The oldest annual Fourth of July celebration is held in Bristol, Rhode Island.

The festivities began just two years after the Revolutionary War ended and this year will make the celebration the 239th anniversary.

7. There are around 15,000 Independence Day fireworks celebrations every year.

Most small towns spend anywhere from \$8000 to \$15,000 on fireworks, with larger cities spending more, like the Boston Pops Fireworks Spectacular which averages more than \$2 million.

8. Americans eat an obscene number of hot dogs on the Fourth of July. We're talking 150 MILLION hot dogs!

9. Americans also spend billions on food to celebrate the Fourth of July.





\$9.5 BILLION to be precise, according to last year's National Retail Federation research. That's \$.93 cents per person!

10. Three presidents have died, and one was born, on the Fourth of July.

Thomas Jefferson (3rd) and John Adams (2nd) both died on July 4, 1826, and James Monroe (5th) on July 4, 1831. Calvin Coolidge (30th) was born on July 4, 1872.
