Gardening Tips For March

Courtesy of Colorado State University Website. Yard/Lawn:

Early Spring, before major planting, is a good time to have your soil tested. That way you'll know what you're dealing with and it will help you prepare your ground for planting. Test kits can be bought at Home Depot as well as on Amazon.

Core aerate the lawn or have it done by a qualified lawn service. Aeration can be done anytime

during the growing season, but to get your lawn off to a good start do it in March. Before aeration make sure the soil is moist to get 3" plugs. Leave plugs on the lawn.

Plants:

Indoors, after March 15th, start seeds under grow lights.

As for your outdoor garden, once the ground can be worked. till in 1" to 2" of composted cotton burrs or aged manure into your vegetable garden. You can get both at your local nursery. Mid-March plant peas and sweet peas directly in the garden, and soak the seeds over-

night. Lettuce can be planted next, then radishes. Fall-bearing raspberries can be planted mid-March.

Garden centers will have small bare-root trees and shrubs and bare-root roses on sale to tempt and tantalize you. Go ahead and succumb! These can be planted from now through April. If you're planting in March look for a time when we have predictions of three or four mild, pleasant days. Soak the roots overnight in a bucket to give plants a good start.



Bamboo: Lucky bamboo comes from Asia and is a plant that grows rapidly and is strong but flexible. Having a lucky bamboo is a table in homes and Feng Shui for years. It symbolizes not only luck but prosperity and makes for an inexpensive but thoughtful gift.

10 Fun and Fast Facts About March Madness

- 1. The first tourney was organized by the National Association of Basketball Coaches. Oregon beat Ohio State 46-33 in the first championship game.
- 2. The Final Four is held in a different city each year. Indianapolis, where the NCAA is based, hosts the Final Four every five years until 2040.
- 3. Each winning university receives a rectangular, gold-plated trophy made of wood.
- 4. Early on, the NCAA was considered a lesser event to the National Invitation Tournament, held in New York City. Teams could compete in both events.
- 5. The 1949–50 CCNY team won both the NIT and NCAA tournaments (besting Bradley both times).
- 6. In 1971 the NCAA barred universities from playing in the NIT and other tournaments if they were invited to the Big Dance.
- 7. In 1978, the NCAA began using the term "Final Four" officially; the name was soon trademarked.
- 8. The 2013 championship won by Louisville and coach Rick Pitino was the first title to be vacated (recruiting scandal).
- 9. Twice in the past 10 years, the Final Four featured three coaches making their first appearance. In 2019, it was first-timers Tony Bennett (Virginia), Chris Beard (Texas Tech) and Bruce Pearl (Auburn). In 2017, it was Frank Martin (South Carolina), Dana Altman (Oregon) and Mark Few (Gonzaga). The champion in 2017 was North Carolina, which won in coach Roy Williams' ninth trip to the Final Four.
- 10. NBC first began broadcasting the Final Four in 1969. CBS later bought the broadcast rights.


