
We will need all hands on deck to sail this ship! Please consider volunteering. Without volunteers, this party would be headed straight to Davy Jones's locker. Please sign up here:

The Schauer family has been a part of The Knolls community since 1972 when they bought their home and

watched it being built. Paul served in the Colorado state legislature for 20 years while working at the Gates Rubber Co. He went on to serve on the University of Colorado Board of Regents for 6 years while he was chairman of the Rock

Products Organization. During that time, he was also on The Knolls HOA board, serving as president for a few years.

Paul leaves behind his wife of 59 years, Cyndy, and four children: Paul E. (Diane), Tim (Angie), Kip (Hanne) and Heidi (Rob), 10 grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

STANDARD REMINDERS:


- The ball machine may only be used by players over the age of 16 or with parental guidance onsite.

- Only use brooms, squeegees or leaf blowers to clear snow and debris from the courts.
- Expired tennis balls can be left in the labeled bin for recycling, or if the ball still bounces well, toss it into the small bucket for the ball machine.
