An Important Reminder From The Board of Directors:

Homeowners must apply for and receive approval from the Architectural Control Committee before beginning any changes to the exterior of their home, including landscape. The fine for not submitting an ACC application prior to making modifications is \$500.

New! Submit ACC Requests Online

Good news, everyone! We've added a new feature to the community website that allows you to submit Architectural Control Committee (ACC) requests **electronically.** This new option is a great alternative to the traditional paper form and can be found by navigating to the "Electronic ACC Request - Exterior" page on the homepage.

This new online solution should help to streamline the ACC process and lead to faster approvals for exterior improvements.

Please note that we will still accept the paper version of the Exterior Improvements forms if you prefer. Also, for now, all paint and roof updates must still be submitted

> using their respective paper forms. We'll be working to get electronic versions for those as soon as we can.

> > **CheKnolls Cup Set** For September 21

On September 21. The Knolls seeks to defend its CheKnolls Cup title against Cherry Knolls at South Suburban Golf Course. Paul Prutch, The Knolls Golf Club President, shared, "This tournament serves as a reminder of how close both communities are, but even more so how much each cherishes bragging rights over the other! We will do everything we can to keep those bragging rights another year!"

Each year since 2020 (after the tournament was resurrected after being dormant for 15+ years), The Knolls and Cherry Knolls neighborhoods field a team to represent them in a 2-person scramble format where a large trophy and bragging rights are awarded to the victor.

Although historically Cherry Knolls had won the award more often, since the 2020 resurrection, The Knolls has the edge winning in 2020, 2022 and 2024. "We are winning this thing and extending our lead to 4-2, and even though I won't be in attendance this year I have no doubt The Knolls brings home the cup," stated Nick Dosen, VP of The Knolls Golf Club.

- To get a court key which opens all the court doors, the tennis ball machine and lower clubhouse level for restroom access, text or call Mike Bradley at 303-887-4275 or Shawn Merkel at 303-478-3852. Keys are \$5, or trade in your old pre-2024 key.

Standard reminders:

- The ball machine may only be used by players over the age of 16 or with parental guidance onsite.
- After court use, please empty the courtside trash bins into trash and recycling and lock up all gates and doors.
- Only use brooms, squeegees or leaf blowers to clear snow and debris from the courts.
- Expired tennis balls can be left in the labeled bin for recycling, or if the ball still bounces well, toss it into the small bucket for the ball machine.

 Friendly reminder that our courts were just re-done which took time and money. Courts are to be used for tennis and pickleball ONLY – wheels, potlucks, non-tennis/pickleball games are not permitted. 




