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CenCON 2/26/2024 Meeting Notes

Centennial Council of Neighborhoods. Tiffany is a member.

South Suburban Parks and Recreation is starting to look for high schoolers (15 and older) to work this summer. If that is a fit for you, check their website for more information. The Arapahoe Library District is hosting a "Meet and Move" which is a walking club centered on the Koelbel Library. It will meet the 2nd and 4th Wednesday at 9:30 am from April through October at Koelbel Library. Check the Arapahoe Library District website for more detail.

Tammy Maurer, who is a City of Centennial Council District 2 member, gave us an update of the Colorado legislature attempting to revive SB213 type legislature where the state would grab control of city and HOA zoning issues. These bills are currently in the Colorado House as bill HB24-1152 which concerns itself with Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs) which essentially loosens standards for building small shacks on your property for people to live in, HB24-1304 which would loosen standards apartment buildings to require parking areas thus forcing their residents to on-street-parking, and HB24-1313 which would create state incentives for building dense housing structures near transit centers.

Vanessa Gates, the Arapahoe County Homeless Coordinator, gave a presentation on the homeless in Centennial. Currently, she has counted approximately 10 families, and 110 singles that are present in Centennial. They are concentrated along the I-25 corridor, and she tries to point them toward resources that will help them get "back into the system" such as temporary housing, getting them a phone and some basic needs. It is frightening for the newly homeless and very tough for her to help since everyone is constantly on the move. If you see a homeless person and want to help, talk to them and help them contact the Arapahoe Community Services at 303-738-8040.
