

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CenCON 6/26/2023 Meeting Notes

Centennial Council of Neighborhoods. Tiffany is a member.

CJ Whelan, the Cencon president, stated that there are 103 HOAs in Centennial but only 23 belong to Cencon. There is going to be a push to try and expand the Cencon membership in the coming year. Andrew Spaulding is heading up this recruitment effort.

Keith Gardner of Tiffany was appointed to fill a vacant spot on the Board of the South Suburban Parks and Recreation District.

The Arapahoe Library District told us about a free Summer Concert on Friday August 18 at Tagawa Gardens featuring the Wash Park Band. You will need to register on the Arapahoe Libraries website. There was some discussion about the problem of meth users using the bathrooms in the libraries such as Bemis in Littleton. Librarians are keeping a watchful eye on the situation.

The Centennial Center Park expansion is complete and the ribbon cutting was scheduled for July 19th. County Commissioner Carrie Warren-Gully (District 1) and Jessica Campbell-Swanson (District 2) gave an update of some county issues as follows: 1) the noise around Centennial Airport has been a concern for some since the shift in flight paths. 2) Dove Valley Regional Park has had some major updates. 3) the county has received \$127.5M of American Rescue Plan money toward homelessness problems. 4) discussed funding issues in light of the current inflation.

Recent observations and at least one serious injury make it necessary for us to remind all of both the leash law and the responsibility of dog owners to be good neighbors. Above all, dogs when on our trails, open space, sidewalks and out in our neighborhood must remain in complete control to avoid injury and property damage. Dogs must remain on the trails or sidewalks and not trespass on other's property. Allowing our dogs to roam freely or on a long uncontrolled lease on the trails, especially near property lines or with other dogs present leads to unnecessary barking and could suddenly initiate an unexpected incident. Incidents do happen and did lead to a person and dog being severely injured. Also it is notably discourteous to allow our dogs to roam freely through the lawns and garden beds of others: So many in our neighborhood here work too hard to maintain beautiful lawns and gardens only to watch inattentive owner's dogs cause damage (even just dog pee). Please pick up after your pets everywhere and dispose of the waste properly. Let's all show courtesy to each other with our pets in our neighborhood and within our wonderful open spaces. Thanks.

Emerald Ash Borer in Littleton

If you have ash trees you need to be aware that the Emerald ash borer has been found in the area and nearby trees will likely become infected over the next several years. Left untreated, this is a death sentence for your ash trees; however, there are preventative treatments available.

According to Lisa Mason, a horticulture specialist and entomologist, "If it is a healthy tree, it is likely a good candidate for insecticide treatments; if the tree is unhealthy, it will most likely have to be removed. The insecticide treatments are systemic, which means the roots uptake the insecticide throughout the tree, so an unhealthy tree is not going to have the root system and be able to transport the insecticides throughout the tree."


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
