Remember, you have 24 hours after the trash has been picked up to store your trash bins where they are not visible from the front of your home. And don't forget to treat those unsightly weeds; they are a real eyesore detracting from the character of the neighborhood.

CenCON 08/25/2025 Meeting Notes

Centennial Council of Neighborhoods. Tiffany is a member.

Kristin Eckmann of South Metro Fire Rescue informed us that they will be requesting the voters to approve a 3-mil tax increase in the November elections to cover their expected \$50,000,000 funding shortfall. The fire district is funded mainly through property tax revenues which have risen sharply over the last dozen years (260% increase) but the gravy train is over with receding commercial and residential property values.

District 2 City Council Member Christine Sweetland informed us that Centennial will be pursuing its own zip code. A separate zip code will help with collecting more tax revenues from online purchases. Also, 78% of all garbage brought to the Aurora landfill is yard and food waste. Though biodegradable, this waste is filling up the landfill. They are looking into composing alternatives.

Amy Padden, the 18th Judicial District Attorney spoke to us about the newly created Arapahoe county ONLY Judicial District which used to also contain 3 other counties. They handle about 10,000 cases/year of which 99% of them are plea bargains. She currently has 73 DAs working for her (soon to be 76) which handle heavy work loads of approximately 125 cases per DA at a time. These are a mixture of felonies and misdemeanors. Recently she has noticed a startling increase in juvenile crimes involving guns.

Littleton Harvest Festival


