You should have received a letter from the City of Littleton regarding the mill and overlay project taking place in Aberdeen Village soon. Phase 1 is storm sewer and grading improvements at select intersections; Phase 2 is asphalt milling and patching and concrete gutter repairs; and Phase 3 is asphalt overlay. The work will take place on the streets throughout the neighborhood other than Elati St. which was done last year. Work will take place from 7 am to 7 pm. 
Pets of Aberdeen


