

Board Member Letter

A special thanks to all of those who volunteered to pick up and drop off street barricades, set up tables and tents, arrange for the bubble party, cook up lots of food, purchase the wine and beer, and all the other myriad tasks that were needed to make this year's annual picnic another success. The Annual Picnic plus the Holiday Party, Fourth of July Parade and Lighting Contest are the four activities that allow us all to build the Aberdeen Village community.

The Aberdeen Village Association provides another service: every two years or so, we include an updated map of the neighborhood with everyone's names on the various houses as an insert within the Aberdeen Village Connections newsletter. Also included is a printed directory listing everyone's name, address, phone numbers, and/or emails, to the extent you want this information published. In my role



as the Association's Secretary, I will be updating the directory database during the month of September. We have had a significant turnover in home ownership during the past two years. If you are new to the neighborhood, I ask that you email me your address, the names of the adults in your home, and any phone numbers and/or emails that you would agree to have published in the neighborhood directory. Once updated, you can stick the neighborhood map and directory on your refrigerator, and you will know how to find, call or email any one of your neighbors.

The Elati Corridor Study: The City of Littleton is currently studying how best to improve pedestrian and bicyclist safety along the portion of Elati that extends from Littleton Boulevard to the southern end of Elati Street where it terminates into the Highline Canal. Shawn Turner, Senior Transportation Planner with the Public Works Department, is in charge of the team implementing the study. When asked regarding the current status of the study, he replied by email:

"As far as project progress, we have received a summary of the first survey results, which we will be posting online in the coming weeks. For a preliminary plan, we are starting to discuss potential alternatives with the consultant team, and we will be sharing those with the public in September. We are also planning to do a "Walk Audit" with the community in September and would love for you and your neighbors to attend. A walk audit is an in-field visit to the corridor to assess its current conditions and potential solutions directly and in person. This community-based event invites residents, stakeholders, and elected or appointed officials to walk segments of Elati Street with the project team and provide firsthand feedback on priorities

to improve safety, comfort, and accessibility. The consultant will also explain potential bike and pedestrian improvements in the field, giving attendees a personal sense of how these improvements might be laid out and their potential impact on the corridor. The observations gathered will help shape future design concepts and ensure they reflect real-world conditions and user experiences. We will be posting the date of the walk audit online sometime this week." (This was written during the week of August 11th.)

I encourage all of you as members of the Aberdeen Village neighborhood to stay informed regarding the findings and plans being made for Elati Street, and to accompany the city planners, elected officials, fellow neighbors and consultants who will be walking through the entire corridor and discussing anticipated changes to the street.

Fall is almost upon us. Enjoy the cooling temperatures, changing light, and initiation of the fall colors!

National Hummingbird Day

National Hummingbird Day happens during the first Saturday in September. Hummingbirds are remarkable birds with unique characteristics that fascinate bird watchers and nature lovers, alike. There are over 300 species of humming-birds throughout the world that belong to the Trochilidae family. The Trochilidae family is known for their small size, beautiful plumage, and amazing flying abilities. This family of birds comes in different sizes, colors, and behaviors that are specific to the location where hummingbirds live.

The average hummingbird is between 2 to 5 inches in length, making it the smallest bird in the world. Known for their beautiful colors, hummingbird feathers are an iridescent mix of greens, blues, reds, and purples. Interestingly, the iridescent color of hummingbird feathers gives the appearance of the feathers changing colors in light.

A hummingbird flaps its wings up to 50 times per second and has amazing flying capabilities. For example, humming-birds move their wings in a figure-eight pattern, allowing them to "hover" in midair. In addition, these unique flying characteristics allow a hummingbird to feed on a flower while in flight. Unsurprisingly, because hummingbirds move so quickly, they feed frequently on nectar from flowers and insects.


