Signs

You may have noticed new signs around the community. They fall into three categories - towing compliance, south metro safety guidance or property management.

- * "Resident Lot" and "Guest Lot" designations and towing signs are to comply with state law House Bill 22-1314 stating that all vehicles entering the community and lots can see the parking rules and grounds for ticketing or towing. We understand that the occasional guest may stay overnight but parking longer than 3 days in the guest lot requires a guest parking permit which can be obtained from the clubhouse manager (columbinelakesclubhouse@gmail.com or 303-795-8222).
- Safety signs mark the end of lots where there is likely a hazard not far away like a body of water or a building.
- * Lot letters help with property management of assigning red tags permits in specific guest lots. Separate letters for carport lots and guest lots helps with consistency around the community as well as things like work orders.
- "No trucks" in the dead-end carport lots is an attempt to help reduce damage to gutters when larger vehicles have to execute a multi-point turn to exit. If you do see a vehicle impact a gutter or carport, please report the company name and license plate or truck number or send a picture to the clubhouse manager or board so we can seek reimbursement for damages.

Xcel Energy Savings

Xcel was able to install 140 LED bulbs – all free of charge to 10 residents' homes! Based on calculations, this will reduce demand by an estimated 1 kW and result in a yearly reduction of approximately 6,300 kWh. Assuming a rate of \$0.12/kWh, savings should be approximately \$756 yearly (aggregated electricity savings). They also installed 5 water-saving measures resulting in an estimated 76 Therms and \$63 of savings annually.

For residents who did not have a chance to sign up the first time or reschedule due to the snow storm, Xcel has offered another day for the Multifamily Buildings Program - Friday, April 19th with deadline sign up Wednesday, April 17th.

On the Wild Side 4/24: The Shovelers are Swirling

Welcome the northern shovelers to our ponds! They have been feeding here steadily for the past month swimming in a mesmerizing rugby-like scrum around the aerators in the ponds. They swim in circles to help kick up the plant and animal life so they can filter the water with the fringe like edges of their beaks. Similar to blue whales, small plant and animal life get in but are trapped inside their mouths as the water gets pushed out.

Their coloring is beautiful with the males having a green head, a white chest and copper-colored sides. The female looks very similar to a female mallard. What sets shovelers apart in appearance from other ducks is the unique shape of their beak. While narrow at the base, the tip flairs out like a spatula or, like its name's sake, a shovel which helps them in feeding.

Shovelers need open water to feed so they can be found in lakes in our area from the spring to fall. They can also be found in shallow ponds where it is easy for them to kick up their food. Their flocks can be small in numbers or in the hundreds as seen in ponds at South Platte Park.

So, if you've wondered what the heck is going on when you see a "scrum" of ducks in the middle of the pond, now you know! They're just "shoveling" their dinner!
