



The guest Recreational Vehicle can only be parked on site for up to 72 hours.

**Q2** Assessment Payments – Your Q2 2023 assessment is due on May 1st. If you have not made a payment or need to check your account balance, please log in to your account Login Instructions | AppFolio. There you'll be able to see your balance and make a payment online. Please contact NCM with questions regarding your account and/or to discuss payment plan options.

Community Dumpster Day – Dumpster Day will be June 1st. The first dumpster will be placed on Nevada Cir. Once that one is full, the second dumpster will be placed on S. Sumner Circle. The guidelines and a list of unacceptable materials for the dumpster will be posted on the portal for your review.

Neighborhood Flags – We need a volunteer to take on the Flag display project. The days on display are Memorial Day, Flag Day, 4th of July, September 11th, and Veterans Day. The flags have generally been placed out at 6:30 am and need to be taken down no later than sundown. There are 40 flags to be placed in designated areas. There are permanent sleeves that have been installed in the ground in these areas, so it is easy to place and remove the flags.
