Please keep in mind that approval is required when making improvements to the exterior of the house and to the landscaping. It may take a few weeks for your plans to be reviewed and approved. Please plan accordingly. You can find the CC&Rs and landscape design guidelines on the community website. You can submit your request and attach your plans online under the Architectural Control tab. Just click on Create Request.

Violations – NCM will be starting their community drives and will be reviewing landscaping and home exteriors for maintenance issues. Please maintain your yards by watering the sod, spraying, and removing weeds and clearing out dead shrubs. If you have outstanding violations and/or repairs from last year, please have these items corrected no later than May 30th. Please contact Irene if you have any questions.

Trash – Trash Day is Friday. Please put trash cans back into the garage or behind the fence after the trash is picked up.

Pets – Please remember to pick up after your pets. Pet waste is not only unsightly, but it can also cause health concerns. Also, keep your dogs on a leash while on a walk or out front of your property for the safety of all people and other animals.

A Colorful Dream is a family-friendly, interactive exhibition by contemporary fine art photographer Adrien Broom. The exhibit features a suite of photographs, some of them large in scale, detailing a young girl's journey as she discovers a series of monochromatic fantasy worlds exploring the rich hues and associations that we have with every color in the spectrum. Community Dumpster Day – Dumpster Day will be June 1st. The first dumpster will be placed on Nevada Cir. Once that one is full, the second dumpster will be placed on S. Sumner Circle. The guidelines and a list of unacceptable materials for the dumpster will be posted on the portal for your review.

Neighborhood Flags – We need a volunteer to take on the Flag display project. The days on display are Memorial Day, Flag Day, 4th of July, September 11th, and Veterans Day. The flags have generally been placed out at 6:30 am and need to be taken down no later than sundown. There are 40 flags to be placed in designated areas.
