Have you noticed the re-faced picnic area just south of the playground? Out with the old brick and rotted railroad ties and in with new stone. Goes well with the new picnic table we picked up last fall. Enjoy!

In memory of longtime HOA Board member, Ken Dold, who passed away two years ago, his wife, Susan, added a bench to the north area in Triangle Park. Those enjoying the park with ball games, frisbee and other activities now have a place to rest. Thanks Susan and family!

Now that all townhome alleys have been redone, it's time to seal

coat the alleys that are three to five years old. Expect to see notices, emails, cones and tape in June when the seal coating begins. Of the 11 alleys, one was seal coated last summer and six to seven will be done this summer.

**AMI Monthly Report**: AMI currently has 398 email addresses out of the 405 owners in SouthPark. With more community notices being sent by email, it's helpful to have your current email address on file. If you're a new homeowner, please make sure AMI has your email address.

The HOA Board recently received updated governing documents for review. The majority of the changes bring our HOA into compliance with State, County and City statutes, which means many questions from the community will be easily answered. The percent of community approval (2/3rds) to

update governing documents will not change. We need it now and will need it in the future. The updated document will be discussed at the May, June and July HOA meetings. In addition,

your HOA Board is discussing a couple open houses to inform residents; emails to follow with dates and times. Also, expect to see your Board members at the July 4 neighborhood party (i.e., at the pool) answering questions and gathering signatures. The community needs 271 signatures to update the governing documents this is going to be a busy summer!

Now that roofers have some nice weather to work, there is no shortage of noise. The woodpeckers have also moved in and their hours are dawn to dusk, so SouthPark expects the same from roofing companies.

Please inform your contractor that when the sun goes down, the community expects some quiet time. Also, as obvious as this may seem, if your roofing company is working on your house/unit, please have them use your outlets for their equipment. The HOA received a report last week of a crew working on one roof with a 100-foot extension cord to a neighbors outlet.

Last, please submit ACC requests for new roofs, painting, landscaping and anything else that you're unsure of.

Next time you're at your local town hall or playground, check for a memorial and take time to read it with your kids.

# Red, White, And Blue Trifle

When you're looking for festive Memorial Day desserts or just an easy summer treat, turn to this red, white, and blue trifle to satisfy your sweet tooth. The key to this patriotic trifle is using fresh, ripe berries. Skip the frozen fruit here.

YIELDS: 8 - 10 serving(s); TOTAL TIME: 30 mins

### Ingredients:

- 8 oz. cream cheese, at room temperature
- 1/2 c. granulated sugar
- 1 1/2 c. heavy cream
- 1 tsp. vanilla extract
- 1 lb. pound cake, cubed

### Directions

- Two 6 oz. containers blueberries (about 2 cups)
- Two 6 oz. containers blackberries (about 2 1/2 cups)
- One 1/2 qt. strawberries, stems removed, sliced
- 1. Combine the cream cheese and granulated sugar in the bowl of a stand mixer with a paddle attachment. Beat on medium-high speed for 1 to 2 minutes until smooth. Scrape the sides and bottom of the bowl. With the mixer on medium, slowly add the heavy cream and vanilla and mix until combined. Switch to the whisk attachment and whip at medium speed until soft peaks form and the mixture is easy to dollop.
- 2. Place a single layer of cake cubes in a large trifle dish (about 12 to 14 cups). Top with 2/3 of the blueberries and blackberries, then 1/2 of the whipped cream (about 2 cups), then 2/3 of the strawberries. Repeat the cake and cream layers once more, then decorate the top with the remaining berries. Serve immediately or make in advance and store for up to 24 hours in the refrigerator.

# **Etiquette For Dog Parents**

Dog parents have a responsibility to manage their pets' behavior and follow certain rules of etiquette. Follow these guidelines to ensure that you and your dog are being courteous community members.

- **Scoop your poop.** Bring several bags on your walks to be sure you have enough. If you run out, either come back and clean it up later, or ask another walker if they have a bag to spare.
- Prevent barking. Practice getting your dog's attention to easily redirect him if he barks at people or other dogs. If you know your dog acts this way, only allow him in the yard when supervised.
- Only let your dog greet a stranger if they ask. The same rule applies if you see another dog and caretaker approaching. Ask first and respect the other's response.
- Always leash your dog on walks. Not everyone is comfortable around dogs. Keep your dog close to you and stay alert to others. Your leash should be short enough to prevent your dog from contacting or jumping on passersby.
- Don't play while on leash. If you meet another dog on a
  walk (and it's alright with their caretaker) let the dogs sniff
  each other for five seconds and move on. Letting your dog
  play with another dog while on leash can result in injury and
  teach your dog that all dogs enjoy this kind of interaction,
  although many don't.
- Be aware of other people's feelings. If your dog does something to upset someone (jumping up, barking) apologize to them and take measures to prevent the situation from reoccurring.
