Winter Fun: Tubing!

ECHO MOUNTAIN

We'll kick off the list with the closest tubing hill to Denver at Echo Mountain Resort. Located less than an hour from the Mile High City, the Echo Mountain Tubing Hill is a convenient place to get your thrills seven days a week. The tubing hill is open to those 36" and taller, no one can ride in someone's lap here. Online reservations are required.

Race your pals or link up amongst your group and create a tube chain.

The covered conveyor lift will bring you back to the top of the 6-lane tubing hill.

KEYSTONE ADVENTURE POINT TUBING HILL

Endless snow tubing fun awaits you at Keystone Ski Resort. Home to two of Colorado's tubing hills: Mountaintop and a family-friendly option at the Nordic Center.

Mountaintop Snow Tubing

at Keystone: Keystone's tubing hill is perched on the summit of Dercum Mountain. Check-in for your reservation at the Adventure Point Tubing Hut at the bottom of the gondola. From there, take the River Run Gondola up to the village. It will drop you off next to Adventure Point, where the tubing hill is.

Nordic Center Snow Tubing: If you don't want to make the trek to the top of Dercum on the gondola, check out the Nordic Center tubing hill. Located between Dillon Lake and the ski resort, the Nordic Center is a calmer alternative to the busy mountain.

COPPER MOUNTAIN TUBING HILL

The Copper Tubing Hill consists of four lanes of varying speeds and slopes. There is a magic carpet lift system to get you up the hill, so there's no worry about having to hike.

To ensure an adventurous time, the staff will give you a push or spin if you're up



utes prior to your start time. The Tubing Hill at Copper can sell out, so you may want to book in advance. Discounts are available if you pre-purchase on Copper's website at least 1 day prior. Riders must be 36" tall.

FRISCO ADVENTURE PARK TUBING HILL

Frisco Adventure Park features a 1200-foot tubing hill with lift service, operating day and night. It's located about a mile from downtown Frisco in Summit County, within the Peninsula Recreation Area.

The tubing hill usually opens for the season around Thanksgiving weekend in November, conditions permitting. It's then open seven days per week through the winter season. Reservations are required for snow tubing. There are several lanes of varying pitches, so some will be gentler and others steeper for more thrilling rides. A surface lift returns you and your tube to the top of the hill for another descent.



Snow Removal From Your Private Property

Many local laws require residents to clear sidewalks within 24 hours after a snowstorm to allow safe use by pedestrians. This is particularly important along school pedestrian routes to prevent children from having to walk in the street.

Owners must place snow from their sidewalks onto their front yard or other areas of their own property, and not into the street. This practice reduces the number of icy areas on streets and ensures proper drainage flow into the storm sewer once snow melts.

Groundhog Day

February 2nd is Groundhog Day, on which the emergence of the groundhog (woodchuck) from its burrow is said to fore-tell the weather for the following six weeks.

Since 1887 an animal in Punxsutawney has been the center of a staged appearance each February 2. In what has become a media event, a groundhog designated Punxsutawney Phil is the center of attention of television weathermen and newspaper photographers. Although promoters of the local festival surrounding Punxsutawney Phil claim that the animals have never been wrong, an examination of the records indicates a correlation of less than 40 percent. (Whether a groundhog does or does not emerge is thought to be related to the amount of fat it was able to store before going into hibernation.)

Year End Market Update and Forecast

We enter this New Year of 2024 with excitement and anticipation for better times and markets ahead. You could say we have a "Cautious Optimism for 2024, which is much better than the Predictable Pessimism" we experienced in 2023!

Here are the major stats from the close of the year: **Active Inventory** is up 4.5% year over year, but up 236% from 2 years ago. **New Listings** were down 17.7% from last year. **Closed properties** where down 18% from last year. The **Average Price** of all 3 categories of home was only down less than 1%. (Economists predicted prices would be down 5-10%)

Let's talk about 2024!

Here are 10 adjustments we feel are coming with confidence in 2024

- 1. Inflation will continue to slow down and put less pressure on Interest Rates.
- 2. The Federal Reserve will lower interest rates 2-5 times in 2024.
- 3. Mortgage Rates will vary from the low to high 6% range, with a chance of dipping into the 5%'s
- 4. Buyers will return to the market, especially first time buyers with reasonable ability to negotiate well on price and terms. The average Residential prices will adjust plus or minus 1-3%
- 5. Sellers will finally return to the market, as pent up demand and basic housing needs will motivate them to sell again regardless of Interest rates.
- 6. The market will see a 20% increase in numbers of homes Sold and go above 50,000 resale homes sold again!
- 7. Builders will increase inventory in 2024, as they have figured out how to sell homes with the right incentives and interest rates.
- 8. The employment and labor markets will tighten, as many businesses will become more frugal and downsize their staff and space.
