

2024 Budget Meeting & 2023 Annual Meeting

Dear Homeowner, The 2024 Budget Meeting has been scheduled for Thursday, November 16, 2023 beginning at 6:30 p.m. virtually via ZOOM. The 2023 Annual meeting will be held directly after the Budget meeting. The Budget meeting allows residents the opportunity to ratify a budget of the projected revenues, expenditures and reserves for the Association's next fiscal year as proposed by the Board of Directors. Unless a majority (51%) of the owners reject the Budget, the Budget will be ratified, whether or not a quorum is present.

The 2024 Budget reflects a \$5.00 increase is required to meet future operating expenses, as well funding reserve expenses.

The 2024 assessment will increase to \$781 annually, or 12 equal monthly payments of \$65.00.

When and where can I pick up my race packet? If you wish to avoid long lines on race day, you may pick up your packet early at Boulder Running Company located at 8116 W Bowles Ave in Littleton. Early packet pick up will be available for those who have registered by Sunday, November 19th. Pick

up will be on Monday, November 20th from 3:00-7:00 p.m., and on Tuesday, November 21st from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. The packet includes your t-shirt, bib, and goody bag. You may pick up for friends and family members. Please bring a copy of the registration confirmation(s).

Are awards given out? Awards will be given to the top 3 male (and non-binary) finishers, the top 3 female finishers, and the top 3 girls and top 3 boys 12 and under.

What is the address of Clement Park where the race is held? 7306 W Bowles Ave Pavillion J (near the large playground equipment)

Can I register day of? Race Day registration will be available if the 1500 participant max has not been met. Cash and VENMO only. \$45 T-shirts are available while supplies last.

Are there any discounts available for groups? If you wish to register a GROUP with a minimum of 10 participants you may do so to receive a 10% discount. All participants must be registered together by one person and paid for with one method of payment. The discount will be applied automatically upon processing your payment. No discount code is necessary.

Can I bring my dog? Yes, friendly dogs are welcome but must be on a leash. Can I bring my child in a stroller? Strollers are welcome.

Test Smoke And CO Alarms

With cold weather arriving and furnaces and fireplaces cranking up, this is a good time to test your smoke and carbon monoxide (CO) detectors to make sure they're functioning properly.

Press and hold the "test" button on the smoke or CO detector to make sure the alarm goes off. Replace the batteries if the alarm doesn't work, or if the batteries are more than a year old, then test again.

Be sure to write the date the battery was replaced on the battery or on a piece of tape stuck to the back of the alarm. It's also a good idea to blow out smoke and CO alarms with canned air periodically to remove dust. Also, be sure to replace any alarms that are over than 10 years.

The Difference Between Veterans Day and Memorial Day

Both holidays were established to recognize and honor the men and women who have worn the uniform of the United States Armed Forces. Memorial Day, which is observed on the last Monday in May, was originally set aside as a day for remembering and honoring military personnel who died in the

service of their country, particularly those who died in battle or as a result of wounds sustained in battle.

Veterans Day is intended to thank and honor all those who served honorably in the military – living and dead - whether in wartime or peace. In fact, Veterans Day is largely intended to thank living Veterans for their service, to acknowledge that their contributions to our national security are appreciated,

and to underscore the fact that all those who served - not only those who died - have sacrificed and done their duty.



To ensure the sacrifices of America's fallen heroes are never forgotten, in December 2000 the U.S. Congress passed and the president signed into law "The National Moment of Remembrance Act," P.L. 106-579, creating the White House Commission on the National Moment of Remembrance. The

> commission's charter is to "encourage the people of the United States to give something back to their country, which provides them so much freedom and opportunity" by encouraging and coordinating commemorations in the United States of Memorial Day and the National Moment of Remembrance.

The National Moment of Remembrance encourages all Americans to pause wherever they are at 3 p.m. local time on Memorial Day for a two minute of silence to remember and honor those who have died in service to the nation.

On October 7, 2016, President Obama signed the Veterans Day Moment of Silence Act. The law requires that the President issue a proclamation calling on the people of the United States to observe a two minute national moment of silence on Veterans Day at 3:11 p.m. Atlantic standard time, 2:11 p.m. Eastern standard time, 1:11 p.m. Central standard time, 12:11 p.m. Mountain standard time, 11:11 a.m. Pacific standard time, 10:11 a.m. Alaska standard time, and 9:11 a.m. Hawaii-Aleutian standard time.
