### **Ballot For Covenant Amendment**

The ballot for the RV storage Covenant issue will be delivered with the June Tales. If you don't receive a ballot, please send an email to President@ HOACanterbury.com or call (303)717-9653. Simply put, a vote in favor of the new amendment will prohibit long term RV, boat, trailer, etc., storage at your

residence if it is visible from the street. Approval of this amendment will not affect the current three day parking rule. A no vote means the covenant will not change.

Over the years, the Board has received many complaints on RV storage and has been challenged and criticized as not adequately enforcing the covenants. Attorneys have told us the current covenant is vague, conflicting and unenforceable. In the past, Jefferson County Zoning would help us enforce the covenant, but recently we were told because of the confusing language in the covenant, they couldn't help us enforce it.

We encourage every homeowner in Canterbury to vote on this issue. Only one vote per household and your address must be filled in by you on the ballot to be counted. There are four ways to submit your ballot: Scan and email to President@HOACanterbury.

com; mail it to PO Box 621382, Littleton, CO, 80162; drop in the ballot box at 10784 W Ontario Pl.; or call (303)717-9653 and I will pick it up. All this information will be included in the ballot.



## **Memorial Day Activities w/ Kids**
