May In Colorado!

“I was strolling through the park one day, in the merry, merry month of May.”

Welcome to the month of May in Colorado! What a month of flowers and blooms, leafing trees and budding plants, early crops, and critters galore. The pollinators are out gathering what sustenance they can from all the new blossoms, and birds fill the trees and shrubs making nests in which their little ones can hatch and grow. This is one of the best times of year to walk and hike; spring in Colorado is a beautiful thing.

What can we celebrate? Beginning on day one, we have May Day. Did you know that May Day has its roots in astronomy? Traditionally, it was the halfway point between the spring equinox and the summer solstice.

As with many early holidays, May Day was rooted in agriculture. Springtime festivities filled with song and dance celebrated the sown fields starting to sprout. Cattle were driven to pasture, special bonfires were lit, and the doors were decorated with yellow May flowers. In the Middle Ages,

the Gaelic people celebrated the festival of Beltane, which means “Day of Fire.” People created large bonfires and danced at night to celebrate. Party on!

The Kentucky Derby is held on the first Saturday; this year, May 2. The Derby is the first of three races known as the Triple Crown. Only 13 horses have earned the prestigious title in American horse racing by sweeping the Derby, the Preakness Stakes and the Belmont Stakes all in the same season. Get yer fancy hats out.

May 5 is Cinco de Mayo, which celebrates the victory of the Mexican army over the French army at the battle of Puebla in 1862. All around Denver you can find parties, music, food, and costumes that reflect the Mexican life and celebrate the Mexican-Americans who are our neighbors.

May 10 is Mother’s Day. What do you have planned for tu madre?

May 16 is Armed Forces Day, when we honor those who serve in all branches of the United States military. Please convey to those who are serving, and have served, how much you appreciate what they have done for our country.

Finally, May 25 is Memorial Day, a poignant reminder of those who lost their lives defending this nation. If you do not routinely fly an American flag, this is traditionally the day to do so.

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A Friendly Reminder About Fire Safety in Columbine Hills

Dear Columbine Hills Neighbor, We hope this message finds you well. As many of you know, our area has experienced unusually dry conditions, and with our proximity to the Wildland-Urban Interface near Chatfield, wildfire risk is something we all need to take seriously.

Recently, a concern was shared within our community regarding certain types of vegetation – particularly dense or highly flammable plants such as junipers and other evergreens – being located close to homes, fences, and structures. These plants can pose an increased fire risk, especially during dry and windy conditions.

While the Columbine Hills Civic Association is not an HOA and does not enforce property requirements, we do care deeply about the safety and well-being of our neighborhood. We kindly encourage all residents to:

- Take a moment to assess vegetation around your home
- Trim or remove highly flammable plants near structures
- Clear dead needles, leaves, and debris
- Consider replacing high-risk plants with more fire-resistant options

Taking small, proactive steps can make a meaningful difference in protecting not only your home, but also your neighbors and our entire community.

If you or someone you know may need help with yard cleanup or mitigation, we encourage neighbors to lend a hand where possible – this is what makes Columbine Hills such a special place.

10 Things Homeowners Should Do Before Summer

Few things are as American as home ownership! Although being a homeowner is the classic American dream, it is actually a big responsibility. Not only is it a large investment, there is the ongoing issue of upkeep and maintenance. This isn't easy to do because every season, every climate and home comes with unique challenges. - Check the gutters, even if you cleaned them before spring. This is the easiest way to make sure that summer showers don't lead to foundation damage. Gutters should be clean of debris, well connected and the downspouts need to usher water away from your foundation.
- Before it gets too warm outside, inspect your home's crawl spaces. You are looking for moisture first, because even a little moisture can lead to mold and rot. You should also take a note of the temperature in these areas to make sure your insulation is doing its job.
- Schedule a summer HVAC check up. This will let you beat the summer rush and catch small issues before they lead to expensive repairs and downtime during the hotter months of the year.
- Inspect your home's irrigation system. This includes examining the lines and nozzles for leaks and clogs. Check your sprinkler heads to make sure they are also working properly.
- Get your yard gear out of storage and check everything out. This includes checking your mower, trimmer and hoses along with anything you rely on for maintenance. Doing things like checking the oil, starting up everything and making sure hoses haven't developed holes over the winter can save you a lot of frustration!
- Schedule pest control! Bugs might be few and far between in the winter but spring and summer is a different story. Schedule pest control now to prevent being overrun by creepy crawlers.

- If winter and spring storms have damaged your trees and shrubs, now is the time to take care of it. Remove dead or unhealthy branches, or call in a professional for help. Luckily, it's a great time to plant if you're wanting to replace dead shrubs or bushes.
- Changing temperatures and moisture can cause big problems for your driveway, sidewalk and foundation. Walk around and examine everything, paying close attention to cracks. If you notice anything new, call a professional to fix it before it grows into a larger, more expensive problem.
- Check all your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors as well as your fire extinguishers. If you don't have any, make this a priority!
- Last but not least, remember to switch out your HVAC filter. Mark it on your calendar and do it more frequently throughout the cooling season. This will help your equipment work properly, and help keep your utility bill in check.
