Traffic & Roads Report

Maintenance: A resident requested the pothole by S. Pierce St. and W. Clifton Pl. be filled because of the difficulty of avoiding it when traveling southbound on Pierce and making a right turn into our neighborhood. The concern was passed to Jeffco Roads and Bridges who are responsible for potholes, etc. A pothole request was entered into their system on November 30th.

The same division was also notified twice about two downed branches on the south side of W. Ken Caryl Ave. just east of Wadsworth as they are on or near the sidewalk.

Sign Updates: I called CDOT on December 1st for an update on the graffiti-filled "Welcome to Jefferson County" sign just north of C470 by S. Kendall Blvd. I had reported it in October. I was told that "No updates would be given as, unlike potholes, it's not presenting a danger to anyone so there's no rush." I later spoke to another customer representative who agreed to follow up on my original request. It looks like I'm back at square one as I received this response from CDOT on December 8th: "Thank you for your recent inquiry related to: Sign damage 124822 (on) C470 near MP 16. Traffic Engineering reports: That is not a sign we maintain." I'll continue to try to figure who IS responsible for the sign's upkeep as neither Jeffco or CDOT have claimed ownership.

I also asked CDOT for an update on the Chatfield Park sign on C470 and Santa Fe that needs to be replaced because it's illegible. I was told it would be added to their list.

Please email me at ckseparks1@gmail.com if you have any traffic or roads concerns in or near our neighborhood. Please exercise extra caution on our wintry roads as we head into 2024.

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Parks Report

Maintenance Updates: In response to a request in early December, Foothills Park & Recreation District (FPRD) staff promptly trimmed branches extending over the sidewalk on S. Pierce St. south of W. Fairview Dr. and chipped everything the following day. Several days later, FPRD was asked to remove a branch that had been dragged from beside a tree on the W. Laurel Park path just north of W. David Dr. Both the branch and a metal piece of edging that had been left by the trash can at the bottom of the path were promptly removed. Staff were also asked to trim a tree overhanging the sidewalk on W. Elmhurst Dr. immediately east of the path going north to the middle bridge. The latter concerns were completed the same day - our sincere thanks to FPRD staff!

West Laurel Park Project Updates: How exciting it has been to watch the many changes already taking place at the park and to envision many more occurring in the months to come.

The first step in the improvements was new shade structures installed at the playground in November after weather studies were conducted to determine the best placement for the shade structures. SCL, the general contractor, has since mobilized:

- Orange fencing around the trees for their protection during construction.
- Additional orange fence to define the construction access route and staging area. These will be restored at the project's end.
- Additional fencing around the basketball court and parking lot to protect those areas during construction.








- The removal of the junipers in front of the park. They will be replaced by grass seed in the spring.
- The removal of the park entry sign. It will be refurbished and installed closer to the parking lot entrance.
- Likewise, the removal of the picnic table on the hill west of the playground. It will also be replaced as will the damaged Columbine Memorial sign near the table.

- The removal of the old irrigation shed on the slope west of the path.
- Pouring of new concrete including pads for new trash cans and benches, trail repairs, and a new sanolet enclosure pad.
- Irrigation replacement will follow.
- A break in work is expected while we wait for warmer temperatures in the spring. Then there will be seeding, sodding and trees. Finally, new tables, benches, trash cans and a sanolet enclosure will be installed after construction is complete!

Please be extra careful when using the park during the construction process so you and your pets don't have a mishap.

We hope all the residents will continue to enjoy and benefit from the trails and playgrounds in the New Year! How To Travel On Snow

Skiing

With over 30 ski areas to choose from in Colorado, there is truly terrain for every kind of skier and snowboarder. All levels and budgets can be accommodated. There are smaller slopes perfect for learning the craft, and big giant playgrounds that keep everyone in your group entertained for days.

Cross Country Skiing

Downhill isn't the only way to enjoy skiing in the Rocky Mountains. Nordic skiing, more often referred to as cross country skiing, is fantastic across the state. There are Nordic centers near all the favorite ski towns and resorts, plus endless miles of trails in the national forests to peruse on your own accord.

Snowshoeing

Most of the aforementioned Nordic centers in Colorado provide access to snowshoers on their multi-use trails. Many will even have snowshoe rentals available, as do many ski resorts. It's not uncommon for ski areas to allow snowshoeing on some of their cat trails (greens), or even have separate trails completely for these winter hikers.

Snowbiking

When written as one word, snowbiking technically implies no motor. A Snowbike® is a registered trademark that's used to glide down the slopes, similar to downhill skiing. You can rent snowbikes at a few places locally, and there are even some ski resorts that allow them on their chairlifts, such as Breckenridge Ski Resort. You then ride down the mountain as you would on your skis or snowboard, except your sitting down on a Snowbike®.

Snow Biking

When snow biking is written as two words, it implies it has a motor. These are sort of like snowmobiles and are used in a similar fashion. There are some snow biking competitions and you could use them in the backcountry (uphill, downhill, on the flats) the same as you would a snowmobile. This version is not a registered trademark and technically needs a space between them, snow bike, however, you still might see it improperly referred to as a snowbike with one word.

Fat Biking

These are bicycles with fat tires and thick treads that are suitable for riding on packed snow. They are becoming more popular in mountain towns, and you can often see someone riding along for fun or transportation. There are even competitions held. There are some shops in select towns that will rent you a fat bike to use for a fun day off the ski slopes.

Snowkiting

Snowkiting is very similar to kiteboarding on water. However, you'll use skis or a snowboard instead of a surfboard. It's simpler to master kiteboarding since snow supplies less friction than water. Do note that snowkiting lessons do require you already have a snow kite and harness available.

Many people attempt snowkiting on frozen lakes, such as Lake Dillon in Summit County. An advantage is that this skill can be later applied to kiteboarding on the water during the warmer, summer weather.
