## **Recreational Vehicle Parking** & Residential Street Parking

#### **Recreational Vehicle Parking**

The Sheriff's Office is responsible for enforcing the parking ordinance. The ordinance allows parking of recreational vehicles (RVs) and trailers when they are parked on a public roadway for fewer than 72 hours within a seven-day period.

RVs and trailers are not allowed to park on a public roadway for more than 72 hours within a seven-day period or be used as overnight accommodations on public property where not otherwise permitted. For more information and to submit a complaint, visit the Sheriff Office's Recreational Vehicles Parking website.

#### **Residential Street Parking**

On-street parking is not allowed in areas that are designated "No Parking" or in places where a vehicle would impede the travel lanes. Parked vehicles must avoid blocking driveways, crosswalks, access gates, fire hydrants, or sightlines at intersections.

If you park on a roadway:

- Do not park within five feet of a driveway.
- Do not park within 15 feet of a fire hydrant.
- Do not park within 30 feet of a stop sign, yield sign, or traffic signal.
- Do not park within 20 feet of a crosswalk at an intersection. This includes marked or unmarked crosswalks (see Pedestrian Crossings).

If a vehicle is illegally parked on the roadway, please contact the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office through the Extra Patrol website or non-emergency line at 303-271-0211.

## **Direct Link Broadband Internet** Servicing Construction DirectLink Broadband Internet Servicing Littleton, Colorado

Recently, Jefferson County approved the DirectLink Broadband Internet project for our neighborhood. DirectLink is taking advantage of an existing utilities easement and is within their full legal right to do that work. The Columbine Knolls Homeowners Association has nothing to do with this project. As a courtesy to our homeowners the Voice Newsletter staff has been in contact with DirectLink as some homeowners have experienced damage to their properties.

If you have sustained damage to your property, please call 303-529-1111 Option 4, Monday- Friday 8am-5pm. Call this number with the details of the issue, your name, address, and phone. This starts a ticket for the reparations team who will then put you on the list for repairs. The Direct Link Customer Service representative said they would respond in 24-48 hours, or as best they could.

#### **Columbine Knolls Covenant:**

C-3. DWELLING SIZE. The ground floor area of the main structure, exclusive of one-story open porches and garages, shall be not less than 1000 square feet for a one-story dwelling, nor less than 800 square feet for a dwelling of more than one-story.

Box 620095, Littleton, CO 80162. A CKHA representative will contact you with approval or modifications.

## **COHOPE Meeting Notes For 11/1/23**

DirectLink is a fiber optic provider based in Parker, CO. www.dlbroadband.com, 303-529-1111. Representatives from DirectLink answered questions. Kiera Jones, Community Relations Specialist, Nicole Cimino, Marketing, Donald Ray, Construction.

#### Questions asked:

- 1. Who pays for damage, for instance, to sprinkler heads? They claim their people are trained to fix, but complaints remain about the quality. If they cannot fix, they will contract the repair out.
- 2. Will they be around next spring when sprinklers are turned on to check for damage? Definitely.
- 3. How can you install boxes near fire hydrants? The County approved.
- 4. Why are you running your service through the front of lots when other services are in the back? All new services are required to be installed in the front of lots, even in new subdivisions.
- 5. What is your depth? Typically, 24", according to County guidelines. Then from box to house the depth is usually 12-18". They will try to accommodate requests for other depths.

- 6. Why are boxes installed every other lot? This is so that 2 houses can be served by 1 box.
- 7. How did you choose which neighborhoods to start in? They talked to the County and chose areas where they could immediately connect to the Internet.
- 8. Can another company now come in and repeat this process? Yes, but this is rare because companies do not want to compete. Quantum, the Century Link fiber optic, is not available here now.
- 9. Ok, so if you will be a monopoly, what will happen to your price over time? They assume, because they are undercutting current prices, that the price of other services will drop.
- 10. How about streaming? They do not have their own, but they contract with My Bundle, a service that allows subscribers to choose the individual streaming service(s) they need.

## **Outdoor Ice Skating Rinks**

You don't have to hit the slopes to have some cold, wintery fun. Check out these rinks to get your ice skating fix.

#### RINK AT BELMAR, LAKEWOOD

Admission (skate rental included): \$10 (\$8 for kids 12 and under; seniors and children two and under skate free) or \$6 if you bring your own skates. Park in the lot at Teller Street and West Virginia Avenue. Even in the daytime, the Rink at Belmar can get plenty of shade, so make sure you check the weather and bundle up. Extreme weather may close the rink, so check online or call ahead to make sure the rink is open as planned. Outdoor heaters and fire pits help friends or parents stay toasty.

#### SKATING IN THE SQUARE, ARVADA

Admission (skate rental included): \$10 (\$7 for kids 12 and under). Take the G Line to Olde Town Arvada, and you'll find a cozy little skating rink in the square on 57th Avenue, between the library and the pedestrian mall. Pick up your skates at the nearby shed and take to the (synthetic) ice.

#### PARKER ICE TRAIL, PARKER

Admission: \$9 (\$7 for kids 10 and under). Skate rental: \$4. The ice circles a center grassy area and is fenced in on both the inside and outside, offering more space for beginners to hold on as they get accustomed to the ice. Located at the edge of downtown Parker in Discovery Park (behind the library), the ice trail offers concessions, skating aids for new skaters, and a handful of fire pits and seating for spectators to keep warm.



#### DOWNTOWN DENVER RINK, DENVER

Admission: Free. Skate rental: \$11 (\$9 for kids 12 and under; fourth graders skate free). The downtown rink sits in Skyline Park, in the shadow of the Daniels & Fisher clocktower between the 16th Street Mall and 17th on Arapahoe Street. Open late on holidays and weekends, the rink offers concessions and locker storage for your belongings. Fourth graders skate free, and double-bladed skates are available in children sizes.

#### **EVERGREEN LAKE, EVERGREEN**

Admission: \$14 (children four and under skate free); \$20 with skate rental included. Skate rental: \$10. Winning the prize for best views while skating, Evergreen Lake is open throughout the winter as weather permits. Learn to Skate classes are available for children, and athletes can sign up for hockey and broomball online.

Regulars or families can purchase 10-punch skate cards for \$120 (\$30 savings). Park at Evergreen Lake House or take the shuttle from Stagecoach Park lower parking lot on weekends and holidays.
