### Take The Guesswork Out Of Your House Numbers!

You know where you live and you may take for granted others will as well. It is surprising to realize some house numbers are not visible or are impossible to read. The Residential Security Survey published on the Jeffco.us website asks these questions:

- 1. Are your house numbers at least 4 inches tall (preferably 6 inches) and clearly visible from the street (both day and night)?
- 2. If your home has a mailbox near the street, are the house numbers clearly visible on the mailbox?

Consider these questions and you may decide to improve your property in this simple, but very important way!

### Sandy Bolton's Recipe Corner

Homemade Lemon Vinaigrette is a special dressing for summer salads. This is a favorite combination - mix greens, blueberries, avocado diced, melon chunks and chopped walnuts or sunflower seeds.

#### Lemon Vinaigrette Salad Dressing

Yield approx. 2/3 cup

- 1/4 c fresh lemon juice
- 1 small garlic clove grated or 1/4 t. garlic powder
- 1 t Dijon mustard
- 1/4 t salt or to taste
- freshly ground black pepper
- 1 2 t honey
- 1/4 1/3 c olive oil

In a small bowl, whisk together all ingredients except the olive oil. If the honey is lumpy, heat the bowl just enough to melt the honey. Add olive oil slowly while whisking and whisk until dressing is emulsified. If the taste is too tangy, add more olive oil.

Store in the refrigerator for 1 - 2 weeks. If olive oil solidifies, let it soften at room temp and stir.

For Creamy Lemon Vinaigrette, whisk in 1/2 c sour cream or Greek yogurt.

This dressing is perfect on salads or fruit salad, delicious on grilled veggies or grilled fish. Bon Appetit!

### **CoHope Meeting Notes From May 3rd**

*Council of Homeowners Organization For a Planned Environment, P.O. Box 620783, Littleton CO 80162, www.cohopejeffco.com* Guest from 5/3/23 was County Commissioner Leslie Dahlkemper.

#### DISCUSSED:

- State land use bill: Commissioners concerned about retaining local ability to focus on development and growth. If nothing passes soon the issue will have to wait until the next legislative session.
- **Property tax relief:** Same timing. The legislature will need to act soon on the Governor's proposal or wait.
- Water quality projects: Chatfield is the third most used reservoir. There is a need to protect the water sources which feed into Chatfield.
- Wildfires: Jeffco is number one for property damage from fire. The county has doubled slash collection. New homes are now required to use fireproof materials, establish clear perimeters.

- **Opioid task force:** They have been working to identify areas of need. 7.6 million in support will be coming to Jeffco over the next 18 years.
- Short-term rentals: The question will be how to enforce new regulations. The Sheriff does not have the necessary staffing. One big request is to maintain the current 1-acre requirement.
- SHRED-A-THON: Metro Denver Crime Stoppers is holding a Shred-a-Thon on Saturday, May 20, 8am-noon. Jeffco's will be at the Sheriff's Dept, 200 Jefferson County Parkway, Golden 80419. Each vehicle is limited to three garbage bags or boxes. See metrodenvercrimestoppers.com for more information.

### Men's Health Week, June 14–20

The purpose of Men's Health Week is to heighten the awareness of preventable health problems and encourage early detection and treatment of disease among men and boys. This week gives health care providers, public policy makers, the news media, and individuals an opportunity to encourage men and boys to seek regular medical advice and early treatment for disease and injury.




### Non-Herbicidal Control of Grassy Weeds in Lawns

- Mow as high as practical during the summer months for the particular grass species present in your lawn. Mow bluegrass, buffalograss, tall fescue, fine fescue and ryegrass at 2 1/2 to 3 inches during the summer. The seeds of some weeds require high light intensity to germinate. The shaded environment near the soil surface in a high-mown lawn helps deter weed seed germination. In addition, the higher mowing height produces a healthier grass plant. Crabgrass and other annual grassy weeds are much more common and aggressive in lawns that are mowed less than 2 inches.
- Mow often enough so that no more than one-third of the grass blade is removed in a single mowing. Letting grass grow tall and then cutting it back to a low height reduces turf density, allowing weed seeds to germinate and grow more easily. It is especially important to mow a lawn more frequently in the spring, when the grass is growing faster. A lawn may require mowing every three to five days during the spring and early summer.
- Irrigate properly to help reduce annual weed infestation. Light, frequent irrigation encourages weed seed germination, even if a preemergence herbicide has been applied.
- Fertilize according to the needs of your lawn species.
- Core cultivate (aerate) the lawn at least once a year to reduce compaction and to control thatch.
