
Ken Caryl Middle School Update

What's Happening? A few changes are taking place at the Ken Caryl Middle School near Marker Park. Here is an update provided by the Principal, Lance Williams and Campus Supervisor, Andreana Boyer.

- KCMS school hours have changed, and they are requesting no outsiders on school property from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM when school is in session. Signage will be installed to help communicate this.
- School property is basically anything South of the tennis courts and includes the track and the two southern baseball fields.
- School activities include track, cross country, flag football, and mountain biking.
- The temporary buildings will be removed during the 2024 summer.
- The school is for 6th through 8th grades and has approximately 725 students.

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Windblown Fences in Columbine Knolls

Ferocious winds the first weekend in April toppled full grown trees, downed branches, and blew over fences to name a few of the damages caused by this windstorm. If your fence was damaged here is information you might need found in the Columbine Knolls Protective Covenants Architectural Control Committee (ACC) Guidelines and Jefferson County.

No PIPSA (Property Improvement Request) needs to be submitted if your fence replacement is the same material, location and height as your previous fence.

ACC Guideline - 6. FENCING SUBMIT

- Plot Plan showing proposed location
- · Materials list
- Sample of the wood finish, if other than untreated wood.
- Proposed start and completion dates
- Perimeter fence in front of house is limited to XX in tall per needs additional discussion

GUIDELINES

- All exterior property line fencing will be either wood or similar plastic/composite material. Chain link fence is not allowed for exterior property line fencing.
- Six (6) foot privacy fence, dog eared cedar or a similar looking composite material. Shorter fences are also allowed.
- These guidelines must also adhere to Jefferson County Building codes.

Fences and Gates: We no longer require a permit for fences in unincorporated Jefferson County. We require a Miscellaneous Permit for gates. All fences and gates must comply with the requirements in the Jefferson County Zoning Resolution.

Know Your Covenants

To keep the neighborhood informed the CKHA Board thought we would share different covenants of Columbine Knolls monthly that all Homeowners are accountable to follow. Our covenants run with the land, meaning they apply to everyone living in Columbine Knolls and are legally enforceable. All the Columbine Knolls covenants can be found on our website at www.ckha.org under Protective Covenants. Please contact the CKHA Board with any questions at info@ckha.org.

Columbine Knolls Covenant: C-8 OIL AND MINING OPERATIONS.

No oil drilling, oil development operations, oil refining, quarrying, or mining operations of any kind shall be permitted upon or in any lot, nor shall oil wells, tanks, tunnels, mineral excavations, or shafts be permitted upon or in any lot. No derrick or other structure designed for use in boring for oil or natural gas shall be erected, maintained, or permitted upon any lot.

- Starting in 2021, they have a new Park Ranger program – 2 park rangers patrol the parks and enforce park rules. The Sheriff will continue to handle crimes in the parks.
- Foothills has 4 regional parks (Clement Park is one), 35 neighborhood parks, 21 greenbelts, 31 miles of trails. Marker Park and Columbine Knolls Park are part of the CK Recreation District, not part of Foothills.
- Foothills has lots of volunteer opportunities, as well as a program for tribute trees and memorial benches. Contact Sarah if interested.
- The park ranger contact no. is 303-409-2314. Call with problems noticed, s/a abandoned vehicles, campsites, trash in streams

COHOPE reminds every one of the Jefferson County Public Library Culture Pass program. Each library cardholder can book two Culture Passes per month. Each pass covers more than one person, and includes many local museums and other places such as the Butterfly Pavilion, Clyfford Still Museum, Colorado RR Museum, Denver Museum of Nature & Science, Dinosaur Ridge, Molly Brown House, and many more. Recreational Vehicle Parking & Residential Street Parking

Recreational Vehicle Parking

The Sheriff's Office is responsible for enforcing the parking ordinance. The ordinance allows parking of recreational vehicles (RVs) and trailers when they are parked on a public roadway for fewer than 72 hours within a seven-day period.

RVs and trailers are not allowed to park on a public roadway for more than 72 hours within a seven-day period or be used as overnight accommodations on public property where not otherwise permitted. For more information and to submit a complaint, visit the Sheriff Office's Recreational Vehicles Parking website.

Residential Street Parking

On-street parking is not allowed in areas that are designated "No Parking" or in places where a vehicle would impede the travel lanes. Parked vehicles must avoid blocking driveways, crosswalks, access gates, fire hydrants, or sightlines at intersections. If you park on a roadway:

- Do not park within five feet of a driveway.
- Do not park within 15 feet of a fire hydrant.
- Do not park within 30 feet of a stop sign, yield sign, or traffic signal.
- Do not park within 20 feet of a crosswalk at an intersection. This includes marked or unmarked crosswalks (see Pedestrian Crossings).

If a vehicle is illegally parked on the roadway, please contact the Jefferson County Sheriff's Office through the Extra Patrol website or non-emergency line at 303-271-0211.

Jefferson County approved the DirectLink Broadband Internet project for our neighborhood last year. DirectLink took advantage of an existing utilities easement and was within their full legal right to do that work. The Columbine Knolls Homeowners Association has nothing to do with this project. As a courtesy to our homeowners the Voice Newsletter staff has been in contact with DirectLink as some homeowners has experienced damage to their properties.

If you have sustained damage to your property, please call 303-529-1111 Option 4, Monday- Friday 8am-5pm. Call this number with the details of the issue, your name, address, and phone. This starts a ticket for the reparations team who will then put you on the list for repairs. The Direct Link Customer Service representative said they would respond in 24-48 hours, or as best they could.





Memorial Day Activities With Kids _

We're so excited for the summer! The pools are opening, the grill's heating up, and school's winding down. But in the midst of the fun, take a few minutes to teach your family that Memorial Day is a special time to recognize the service men and women who've fought for our country.

Explain the History of Memorial Day

The Memorial Day tradition began around the Civil War, when folks wanted to honor the soldiers who had died in that conflict by decorating their graves. There's some disagreement over whether this started in the south or in Waterloo,



NY, but in either case, the tradition started as Decoration Day. Families would gather together at cemeteries, bringing picnics and remembering, together, those whom they had lost. Gradually Decoration Day became Memorial Day, and in 1971, Memorial Day became a national holiday to be celebrated on the last Monday of May. While Memorial Day is specifically a holiday to recognize the sacrifices of men and women who have died in combat, many people also spend the day honoring veterans and current service personnel and working for peace and unity with all people.

Watch a Parade or Memorial Service

We have some local parades, and kids love a parade, but you can also take the opportunity to point out traditions and Memorial Day etiquette. Teach children that we stand and take off hats as veterans pass in a parade. Have them look for American flags, and point out that, officially, flags are to be flown at half-staff until noon on Memorial Day as a remembrance. During services you may also see soldiers fire rifles into the air or people throwing flowers into the ocean in memory of those lost at sea. Next time you're at your local town hall or playground, check for a memorial and take time to read it with your kids.

Make a Tasty Treat

Bring cookies or another treat to our neighbor, a World War II veteran. It's wonderful to recognize someone your kids know. But it's also fun to enjoy a treat yourselves! A simple one is a blueberry and strawberry parfait with yogurt, whipped cream, or ice cream. Put them into clear plastic containers to show the patriotic colors, and pop them into the freezer if it's a hot day.

Craft Something Special

Want to slide in a history lesson while keeping little hands busy? You can help kids make a tissue paper poppy while explaining about Memorial Day's origins, then explain that poppies, because they are blood-red, became a symbol of sacrifice during World War I. These are easy to create, and they make a lovely gift.

Help Protect Loved Ones From Scams

Our victims of scams are not numbers, however; they're real people. People like Susan, who was victimized and whose name we have changed to tell her story.

Susan, 76, got a call from a man claiming to work for an Internet provider. He told her that while he was checking her Internet speed, he noticed she had a \$500 credit on her account for services she was entitled to but did not use. He instructed her to get on her computer and when she did, a page was already open that she did not recall opening. The caller told Susan she had accidentally hit a button that selected a refund of \$5,000 instead of \$500. The caller then told Susan he would lose his job if he didn't get the extra \$4,500 back.

The caller instructed Susan to withdraw \$4,500 from her bank and purchase nine \$500 gift cards. He stayed on the phone with Susan while she went to the bank and two separate stores to purchase the gifts cards. During the call, Susan asked him several times if he was scamming her. He said no. Once she had the gift cards, the caller instructed her to tell him the gift card numbers and security codes. Susan did. After the call ended, Susan tried calling his phone number back but the number was disconnected.

Unfortunately Susan was scammed for \$4,500.00. Could the same happen to your parents? Your grandparents? Even you? Scams come in many forms, but how we should respond to them is the same:

 Do not answer calls from unknown numbers. If it's important, they'll leave a message.

- Do not provide personal information on the phone or in an email or text message to anyone you do not know.
 Personal information includes date of birth, social security number, credit card numbers, and bank account information.
- Do not withdraw money, send money, purchase gift cards, or make other financial transactions for someone you do not know.
- If you suspect it's a scam, end all communication hang up the phone or delete the email or text message.
- If you have been scammed or your personal information has been used without your knowledge or permission (for example, a new credit card arrives in your name), report it to local law enforcement immediately (and cancel the card!).
