See any potholes in the neighborhood? Please report them! It is an easy process, and they will get filled very quickly! Here is how to report them:


- 1) Scan QR code, or go to: https://www.jeffco.us/787/Road-Bridge-Division



## Pick Peaches In Palisade

Colorado may not be known for the abundance of fruit it grows, but we are certainly proud of the peaches that come from the bountiful farms in Palisade. Found along the Western Slope near Grand Junction, the town is home to numerous farms, orchards, and vineyards that grow everything



from wine-producing grapes to the juiciest peaches around.

The entire harvest season runs from late June to early October. While you can purchase Palisade peaches from almost any grocery store or at your local farmer's market, one of the most memorable ways is to pick your own. 


# **Cormorants Fly High at Clement Park**

Johnson Lake at Clement Park hosts a broad range of birds and fowl. Our feathered friends can be observed not only entering and exiting the water but also tucked into the thistle and cattails along the shoreline.

While taking my daily walks (from March until late May), I began to see quite a few birds flying up into a cottonwood tree located on the southside of the lake. They would perch themselves on branches without leaves. If you walk in a clockwise direction, you would have seen this amazing choreography begin with five or six participants and quickly grew to my all-time-high count of seventeen, with six in the water still fishing.

Cormorants, I discovered, lack the ability to waterproof their feathers and must partially spread their wings to expose their wet feathers to the sun and wind. This seems like a disadvantage but actually decreases the bird's buoyancy, thus enabling it to swim after the fish it preys by sealing its nostrils



and using its long rudder-like tail to propel itself long distances. This bird also has excellent underwater vision and hearing.

So why so many cormorants this year? It seems that Johnson Lake is a great place for breeding. You can tell the breeding cormorants by their bright orange throat pouch and black or white plumes streaming back from the eyebrows (seen only at close range). Cormorant numbers are increasing so new "restaurants" must be found to support their growing families. Enjoy the wildlife.
