Tennis/Pickleball Court Issues

The Pickleball addition to the Tennis court has been used a lot. Unfortunately, some of the users are not playing tennis or pickleball.

- 1. Dogs are being unleashed and allowed to run free on the courts. The court is not intended for dog exercise and can be harmful to the dog. In addition to causing damage to the court, it can be harmful for the dogs. According to VetChat. com, "Tennis courts are potentially hazardous and are responsible for many pad injuries for dogs. The surface is abrasive. Running and playing on that surface can cause cracks, cuts or tears on the paw pad. This exposes the underlying sensitive tissue making for a painful injury that can take weeks to heal."
- **2. Bikes** and **skateboards** are not permitted on the court. These damage the court surface.
- **3. Shovels** are being used to remove snow from the court. This damages the surface of the court.

Please use the court, but only to have fun playing the games of tennis and pickleball!

Wildfires have had devastating effects on Jefferson County. Due to the county's geographic makeup, wildfire is always a concern, and it is a more potent threat during droughts or dry spells. Jefferson County Sheriff's Office collaborates with multiple agencies and the public to ensure the wildland fire management programs are fully integrated. The Sheriff's Office interacts with partners and cooperators to include planning, preparedness, suppression, restoration, monitoring, research and education components of fire management.

Winter Recipe

Legend has it that the creation of French Onion Soup dates back to King Louis XV of France. Late one night in the 18th century, the king found himself in need of a simple meal. He discovered some basic ingredients in the palace kitchen. The result was a delicious and satisfying soup that not only pleased the king; but has endured through the ages as a comforting dish that warms the body and soul.

FRENCH ONION SOUP

Ingredients:

- 4-6 large yellow onions (~ 5 pounds), peeled and diced (Yes, it's a lot of onions.)
- 4 TBSP, butter
- · Kosher salt, to season
- 1 TBSP all-purpose flour
- 1 cup red wine (Zinfandel, Cabernet, etc)
- 2-3 Quarts beef stock (8 cups)
- Herbs to taste (e.g. thyme, tarragon, basil, etc...), black pepper. For a traditional french soup, incorporate the herbs by use of bouquet garni, a bundle of herbs usually tied together with butcher's twine
- 8 to 12 (1-inch) slices French Baguette (or other bread)
- Grated Gruyère cheese (to top)

Instructions:

- Peel, and chop onions. Eye protection might be needed, depending on your sensitivity to chopped onions. I use Ski Goggles.
- Melt butter in a large stock pot over medium heat. Add onions and salt. Stir often until onions have developed a deep caramelized color. About 40-60 minutes.
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- 3. Increase heat to medium-high, add flour, stir. deglaze with red wine.
- 4. There will be burned brown bits stuck to the sides and bottom of the pan, also known as "fond," that's good! Deglazing is a technique used to loosen and dissolve flavorful bits of food during the cooking process. It employs the use of a liquid, and "scraping" the pan.
- 5. Add stock, herbs, and pepper. Bring to a boil, then reduce heat to a simmer for 20-30 minutes. Ladle into a soup bowl.
- Take sliced Baguette, and top with grated Gruyère. Melt using your oven's broil setting. BE CAREFUL! The difference between deliciously melted cheese, and a burned mess is mere seconds. Serve and enjoy.

Meeting minutes of December 13, 2023

The Leawood Metropolitan Recreation and Park District Board meeting was called to order at 6:15 p.m. by President Kyle Sargent. Members present: Judy Anderson/Vice President, Donna Snyder/Treasurer, Maggie Tocco and Myra Pasco. Other District: Debby Baker/Secretary and Dave Padilla/Park Manager. Visitor: Dutch Creek resident Craig Peterson

Approval of Agenda – The proposed agenda was approved without objection.

Approval of Minutes – Judy moved that the minutes of the November 8, 2023, meeting be approved. Maggie seconded and the minutes were approved without objection.

Public Comments – A few residents had negative comments about plowing in the parks after the last snowstorm. **Board Response:** Dave was unable to clean the sidewalks due to illness. Weston agreed to step up and do what Dave was unable to do. This was the first time Weston had removed snow for us. Dave will meet with Weston to train them on what and how the sidewalks are cleaned in case they are needed in the future.

Treasurer's Report – Donna presented the Treasurer's Report. Bills to be paid this month include Weston, Waste Management, Xcel Energy, Denver Water, Doggie Walk Bags, Honey Bucket, SDA (annual insurance premium) Dave's invoice, and reimbursement to petty cash. Judy moved that the Treasurer's Report be received, and bills paid. Maggie seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Parks Manager Report – Snow removed, and doggie bags checked and replenished as needed. Fall cleanup is being done. Vandalism continues to be a problem in all the parks.

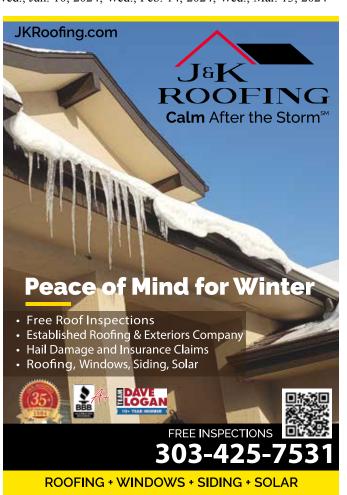
(A) Weaver Park: Dogs are being unleashed and allowed to run free on the tennis/pickleball court. According to Vet Chat.com: "Tennis courts are potentially hazardous and are responsible for many pad injuries for dogs. The surface is abrasive. Running and playing on that surface can cause cracks, cuts or tears on the paw pad. This exposes the underlying sensitive tissue making for a painful injury that can take weeks to heal." In addition, dogs are causing damage to the surface of the court. Damage is also being caused by bikes, skateboards, and shovels (being used to clear snow). There are signs located at the court stating that the use of bikes and skateboards are prohibited. A notice will be placed in the Rapporter highlighting the issue. The Board asks all residents to help us protect the tennis/pickleball court.

- (A) Discuss future of the District Board The Board discussed the future of the District given the expected resignation of the long-serving treasurer, the nearing resignations or retirements of others, and the overall lack of interest of the community to commit and serve on the board. 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How To Travel On Snow

Skiing

With over 30 ski areas to choose from in Colorado, there is truly terrain for every kind of skier and snowboarder. All levels and budgets can be accommodated. There are smaller slopes perfect for learning the craft, and big giant playgrounds that keep everyone in your group entertained for days.

Cross Country Skiing

Downhill isn't the only way to enjoy skiing in the Rocky Mountains. Nordic skiing, more often referred to as cross country skiing, is fantastic across the state. There are Nordic centers near all the favorite ski towns and resorts, plus endless miles of trails in the national forests to peruse on your own accord.

Snowshoeing

Most of the aforementioned Nordic centers in Colorado provide access to snowshoers on their multi-use trails. Many will even have snowshoe rentals available, as do many ski resorts. It's not uncommon for ski areas to allow snowshoeing on some of their cat trails (greens), or even have separate trails completely for these winter hikers.

Snowbiking

When written as one word, snowbiking technically implies no motor. A Snowbike® is a registered trademark that's used to glide down the slopes, similar to downhill skiing. You can rent snowbikes at a few places locally, and there are even some ski resorts that allow them on their chairlifts, such as Breckenridge Ski Resort. You then ride down the mountain as you would on your skis or snowboard, except your sitting down on a Snowbike®.

Snow Biking

When snow biking is written as two words, it implies it has a motor. These are sort of like snowmobiles and are used in a similar fashion. There are some snow biking competitions and you could use them in the backcountry (uphill, downhill, on the flats) the same as you would a snowmobile. This version is not a registered trademark and technically needs a space between them, snow bike, however, you still might see it improperly referred to as a snowbike with one word.

Fat Biking

These are bicycles with fat tires and thick treads that are suitable for riding on packed snow. They are becoming more popular in mountain towns, and you can often see someone riding along for fun or transportation. There are even competitions held. There are some shops in select towns that will rent you a fat bike to use for a fun day off the ski slopes.

Snowkiting

Snowkiting is very similar to kiteboarding on water. However, you'll use skis or a snowboard instead of a surfboard. It's simpler to master kiteboarding since snow supplies less friction than water. Do note that snowkiting lessons do require you already have a snow kite and harness available.

Many people attempt snowkiting on frozen lakes, such as Lake Dillon in Summit County. An advantage is that this skill can be later applied to kiteboarding on the water during the warmer, summer weather.
