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Notes From The January Board Meeting

We hope everyone has thawed from the deep freeze a few weeks ago! The Board met on January 10th with zero residents in attendance. We established the need for some changes moving forward on a few fronts: to start, we are going to alter how this portion of the monthly newsletter is structured to convey the status of the immediate, mid- and long-term initiatives that the board is undertaking. We want to be sure that everyone understands that while we have all signed up to provide services for our wonderful neighbors, this is a strictly voluntary position, and the time we spend on each task is not trivial.

In the next two months, we will be evaluating competing proposals for our landscap-

ing maintenance and management. This contract covers services for all our common spaces as well as the areas around Woodbourne (Simms easements as well as the Fremont entrance). Keesen Landscaping has provided us with admirable services, but each term we feel the need to understand if our services and cost value is in-line.

We also require some fairly invasive maintenance to the pool mechanics. It will cost approximately \$24,000 to replace our pool filter, which has been in place since the pool was built. The motor that provides the power to push water through the filter also needs to be rebuilt. That bill is \$2,550. We lucked out last season when the pump

motor seemingly failed and we were only out of commission for a few days. It turned out that a piece of pool surface (from the resurfacing project) got lodged in the gears. Although serviceable at the time, there was damage, but luckily we were able to make it through the rest of the season. We are also going to finance a new motor to keep as a spare (\$6,500), as the time to repair the motor or purchase a new one can take 6-8 weeks, and we will not have that kind of time during the pool season. There is also a leak in the feed lines of the wader pool, which will require removal of cement and locating the cracked pipe(s). That bill will be approximately \$10,000, assuming that the leak detection company got the position of the leak correctly.

We also voted to begin the contractor selection process for the Clubhouse Renovation project. We will be removing walls, replacing flooring, building an accent wall with an electric fireplace, flat screen smart television, as well as a Chromecast or Firestick to allow for streaming of specific content if needed by those who will utilize the space. We would like to thank Simon for his work on aligning the competitive bids and putting the proposals together. We hope to start work as soon as we can get on our chosen contractor's calendar.

Woodbourne is looking for volunteers to reconstitute our Architectural Control Committee. We need 3-5 members who will become familiar with our covenants, guidelines and integrate with new Colorado statutes around Xeroscaping and limits on HOA controls for neighborhoods. Please reach out to Adam Sherris at adams@woodbournehoa. com if you interested in joining.

The Board is also looking at alternative methods to deliver this newsletter to all residents. We have seen a need to provide more detailed information to our neighbors. We are in initial research on options and will provide more detail as we zero in.

Clubhouse Reservations



February 2nd is Groundhog Day, on which the emergence of the groundhog (woodchuck) from its burrow is said to foretell the weather for the following six weeks.



In what has become a media event, a groundhog designated Punxsutawney Phil is the center of attention of television weathermen and newspaper photographers. Although promoters of the local festival surrounding Punxsutawney Phil claim that the animals have never been wrong, an examination of the records indicates a correlation of less than 40 percent. (Whether a groundhog does or does not emerge is thought to be related to the amount of fat it was able to store before going into hibernation.)

Winter Fun: Tubing!

ECHO MOUNTAIN: Located less than an hour from the Mile High City, the Echo Mountain Tubing Hill is a convenient place to get your thrills seven days a week. The tubing hill is open to those 36 inches and taller, no one can ride in someone's lap here. Online reservations are required. The covered conveyor lift will bring you back to the top of the 6-lane tubing hill.



KEYSTONE ADVENTURE POINT TUBING HILL:

Mountaintop Snow Tubing at Keystone: Keystone's tubing hill is perched on the summit of Dercum Mountain. Check-in for your reservation at the Adventure Point Tubing Hut at the bottom of the gondola. From there, take the River Run Gondola up to the village. It will drop you off next to Adventure Point, where the tubing hill is. Nordic Center Snow Tubing: If you don't want to make the trek to the top of Dercum on the gondola, check out the Nordic Center tubing hill. Located between Dillon Lake and the ski resort, the Nordic Center is a calmer alternative to the busy mountain.

COPPER MOUNTAIN TUBING HILL: There is a magic carpet lift system to get you up the hill, so there's no worry about having to hike. Double tubes are available for those looking to ride together. The tubing hill is located behind Copper Station in East Village. Look for the Super Bee chairlift. Sessions last for 1 hour and you should arrive 15-30 minutes prior to your start time. You may want to book in advance. Discounts available if you pre-purchase on Copper's website at least 1 day prior. Riders must be 36 inches tall.

FRISCO ADVENTURE PARK TUBING

HILL: Frisco Adventure Park features a 1200foot tubing hill with lift service, operating day and night. It's located about a mile from downtown Frisco in Summit County, within the Peninsula Recreation Area. The tubing hill usually opens around Thanksgiving weekend, conditions permitting. It's then open seven days per week through the winter season. Reservations

are required for snow tubing. There are several lanes of varying pitches, so some will be gentler and others steeper for more thrilling rides. A surface lift returns you and your tube to the top of the hill for another descent.

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
