Notes From The June Board Meeting

Here we go!! Two weeks into summer and it's been a roaster, with a nice and pleasant end to June. Hopefully family vacations (either past or future) have been ones for the record books.

On June 11, we were able to successfully hold our Annual Meeting. We had over 120 proxies and a few in attendance at the clubhouse. We conducted a reading and approval of 2023 meeting and received approvals. There was an in-depth discussion around the pool and the management company transition. Unfortunately, after a detailed contract review of the duties stipulated in the pool management contract, we felt we were not being treated equitably, nor were services being provided.

We have since terminated that contract and are now in much better hands with Aspen Aquatics. Hopefully everyone has seen the emails about this latest transition, what it means in terms of duties and definitions with the "pool monitors", and that this change in no way exposes Woodbourne or the monitors to any inherent liability, Visitors will see new NO LIFEGUARD ON DUTY signs, but the pool monitors have been explicitly instructed that if there is a water rescue required that they should do everything to assist all others in the resolution of that incident. They are not instructed to stand down in any way and would work with parents and residents towards resolution.

Our annual garage sale was a success with nice weather and representative participation. The large trash pickup provided residents with an opportunity to dispose of items unsold and not included in the weekly trash service.

As mid-summer emerges, just a gentle reminder of a few covenant controls:

1. No items marked "FREE" may remain anywhere on your property for more than 48 hours. This pertains to the easement property outside of the fences along W Meadows and S Simms St. and never within common areas

- Easement property between the fence line and the sidewalk on W Meadows Dr is the homeowner's responsibility. This includes weed/shrub abatement and overhang of trees/bushes. We are allowing residents through the end of September 2025 to address trees and bushes that extend past the fence line onto easement property.
- 3. All exterior renovations, including landscaping, home painting, roof replacement and removal or replacement of trees/shrubs, must be authorized by our ACC. Forms are available on the ACCU portal, or
- any board member can assist with a link or copies of the forms for submission.
- 4. No commercial or business labeled vehicles can be parked in our neighborhood unless lettering/signage is covered while on the driveway.

We ask that no recreational vehicle or trailer be kept in the driveway for more than 72 hours. And although we do not hold control for recreational vehicles parked in our streets, please be thoughtful for how long (and where) vehicles are parked, as we have received complaints about them creating blind spots for cars and pedestrians.

We continue to work on pool furniture replacement and clubhouse restroom renovations for after the pool closes. We may require a long-term storage pod to be kept in the pool parking lot especially when new pool furniture has been purchased to help protect our new investment.

We continue to wish the Wave swim team success and look forward to their State competitions in July, and we appreciate your support and diligence in ensuring our neighborhood remains a primary target of new homeowners and young families.

Berry Trifle: 8 to 10 servings; Total Time: 30 mins

- INGREDIENTS1 angel food cake, cut into cubes
- 3.4 oz box instant vanilla pudding mix
- 2 cups cold milk
- 8 ounces cream cheese, at room temp
- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 8 ounces Cool Whip
- 2 pints blueberries, rinsed
- 2 pints strawberries, rinsed, hulled and sliced

INSTRUCTIONS

In a small bowl, combine the vanilla pudding mix with the milk and whisk for two minutes; set aside.

In a large bowl, beat the cream cheese on medium speed until smooth and creamy, 2 to 3 minutes. Reduce speed to low and gradually add the powdered sugar. Once all of the sugar is incorporated, increase speed to medium and beat for 1 minute, or until thoroughly combined and smooth.

Add the prepared pudding to the cream cheese mixture and gently fold and stir with a rubber spatula until completely combined. Add the Cool Whip to the bowl and fold it into the mixture until no white streaks remain.

To assemble the trifle, alternate layers of angel food cake, blueberries, the pudding mixture, strawberries and so on, until you get the top. Add a final layer of the pudding mixture, then arrange the remaining strawberries and blueberries in a decorative pattern. This is best served within 24 hours of making it, but leftovers can be stored in the refrigerator for up to 3 days.




