Notes From The October Board Meeting

Bring on the holidays! The October Board meeting was held a week earlier than usual to accommodate schedules, and two residents were in attendance. The meeting was primarily focused on the 2024 pre-planning and continued reviews of our 2023 budget alignments. We discussed the price increases being proposed in both our landscape company and pool management contracts. We firmly believe these can be negotiated in our favor and remain within our margin of expectations.



We will be asking for a multiyear pool management agreement so that we can budget for COLA (Cost-of-Living Adjustments), minimum wage, and other factors that will seemingly continue to escalate as our economy settles into a new normal. We will also be ratifying our 2024 budget at the November 8th meeting.

Last month's newsletter detailed the list of priorities for the Clubhouse renovation project, which will be centered around (mostly) cosmetic upgrades to both the main room and foyer.

We will be taking a multi-phased approach to keep cost down and ensure there are no delays to the start of the pool season. Phase 2 (next fall) will be focused on the bathrooms, kitchen and exterior. To better assess and compare the list of quotes we received over the last two months, the Board discarded two of the original estimates due to their high cost and scope of work. We met with two new contractors in September whose numbers and scope were more in line for comparison, and we believe we are now prepared to align certain upgrades or replacement costs to our reserve study, and then establish where cost may be allocated to that budget vs. operationally. Our next priority is choosing a contractor and getting them onto a schedule. We anticipate work commencing after the holiday season to ensure we do not interfere with the Holiday Hayride and festivities, and we will also need work around other initiatives taking place in the pool equipment room tied to the wader pool leak. If you have any questions or ideas for this exciting initiative, please consider joining one of our upcoming Board meetings or email simonw@woodbournehoa.com — we'd love to hear from you.

As temperatures begin to change, please look to address any immediate issues with your trees, bushes or other landscaping areas that will be affected by snow load or wind. We have seen some improvement with the fence lines from Frost to Simms St, but there are still many limbs and bushes protruding over the sidewalks – please continue to assess your individual fence lines between now and Spring. Also, be sure you are thinking about priority of projects for 2024 so that we can get those approved via the ACC review process.

Wishing everyone a warm and pleasant Fall break and Thanksgiving.

The Difference Between Veterans Day and Memorial Day

Both holidays were established to recognize and honor the men and women who have worn the uniform of the United States Armed Forces. Memorial Day, which is observed on the last Monday in May, was originally set aside as a day for remembering and honoring military personnel who died in the service of their country,

particularly those who died in battle or as a result of

wounds sustained in battle.

Veterans Day is intended to thank and honor all those who served honorably in the military - living and dead – whether in wartime or peace. In fact, Veterans Day is largely intended to thank living Veterans for their service, to acknowledge that their contributions to our national security are appreciated,

and to underscore the fact that all those who served - not only those who died - have sacrificed and done their duty.

To ensure the sacrifices of America's fallen heroes are never forgotten, in December 2000 the U.S. Congress passed and the president signed into law "The National Moment of Remembrance Act," P.L. 106-579, creating the White House Commission on the National Moment of Remembrance. The commission's charter is to "encourage the people of the United States to give something back to their country, which provides them so much freedom and opportunity" by encouraging and coordinating commemorations in the United States of Memorial Day and the National Moment of Remembrance.

The National Moment of Remembrance encourages all Americans to pause wherever they are at 3 p.m. local time on Memorial Day for a two minute of silence to remember and honor those who have died in service to the nation.

On October 7, 2016, President Obama signed the Veterans Day Moment of Silence Act. The law requires that the President issue a proclamation calling on the people of the United States to observe a two minute national moment of silence on Veterans Day at 3:11 p.m.

Test Smoke And CO Alarms

With cold weather arriving and furnaces and fireplaces cranking up, this is a good time to test your smoke and carbon monoxide (CO) detectors to make sure they're functioning properly.

Press and hold the "test" button on the smoke or CO detector to make sure the alarm goes off. Replace the batteries if the alarm doesn't work, or if the batteries are more than a year old, then test again.

Be sure to write the date the battery was replaced on the battery or on a piece of tape stuck to the back of the alarm. It's also a good idea to blow out smoke and CO alarms with canned air periodically to remove dust. Also, be sure to replace any alarms that are over than 10 years.



Pumpkin Dump Cake

Putting the name aside, Pumpkin Dump Cake is a delicious twist on pumpkin pie that's perfect for fall! It's a cake on top of a pumpkin pie without the hassle of a pie crust!

Ingredients

- 1 15 oz can pumpkin puree (not pie filling)
- 1 10 oz can evaporated milk
- 3 eggs
- 1 cup brown sugar
- 3 tsp pumpkin pie spice
- 1 15.25 oz box yellow cake mix (just the dry mix)
- 1 cup butter melted (2 sticks)

Frosting glaze

- 2 cups powdered sugar
- 2 tbsp milk
- 1 tsp vanilla extract

Instructions

- 1. Mix the pumpkin, milk, eggs, sugar and pumpkin pie spice in a bowl with a whisk.
- 2. Pour the pumpkin pie filling in a greased 9x13 baking
- 3. Sprinkle yellow cake mix evenly over the top.
- 4. Pour melted butter over the cake mix.
- 5. Bake at 350° for 45-50 minutes, until center is set and a toothpick comes out clean.

Frosting Glaze

Mix the powdered sugar, milk and vanilla in a bowl with a whisk until smooth. Pour over the top of the cake while it's still warm. Let it cool and harden to a sweet crackled glaze on the top.
